

Dear Responsible Parties:

As you are aware, the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) is reviewing the fuel case file for the above referenced site for potential case closure. A public notification of potential closure was issued in late July 2018, and the 60 day comment period ended on October 2, 2018. ACDEH did not receive an inquiry or comment regarding the potential closure of the environmental case. Therefore, ACDEH requests that you address the following technical comments and send us the items requested below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

 <u>Monitoring Well Destruction</u> – All groundwater, soil vapor monitoring, and remediation wells must be properly destroyed under permit by the appropriate well permitting agency. In order to expedite the case closure process, ACDEH requests that you initiate the well destruction permitting process upon receipt of this letter by contacting Alameda County Public Works Agency at (510) 567-6791 to obtain the necessary permits.

Please complete the destruction of remaining wells by the date listed below.

- Well Destruction December 14, 2018
- <u>Waste Removal</u> All investigation and remediation derived materials must be removed from the site and properly disposed of at an appropriate designated facility in accordance with applicable State laws. Please be aware that three signatures (generator, transporter, and receiving facility) are required on the final waste removal manifests.

To satisfy this requirement, please complete waste removal activities by the compliance date listed below.

- Waste Removal December 31, 2018
- 3. <u>Well Destruction and Waste Removal Report</u> Prepare a report documenting well destruction and waste removal activities. The report must include a well status table, well destruction permits, and waste manifests signed in triplicate by the accepting disposal facility.

To satisfy this requirement, please submit the report to the State Water Board's Geotracker website in accordance the compliance date listed below.

REPORT & DELIVERABLE REQUESTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

A complete report submittal includes the PDF report and all associated electronic data files, including but not limited to GEO_MAP, GEO_XY, GEO_Z, GEO_BORE, GEO_WELL, and laboratory analytical data in Electronic Deliverable Format[™] (EDF). Additional information on these requirements is available on the State Water Board's website (<u>http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/</u>)

- Do not upload draft reports to GeoTracker
- Rotate each page in the PDF document in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.

Each report submittal is to include a GeoTracker Upload Summary Table with GeoTracker valid values¹ as illustrated in the example below to facilitate ACDEH review and verify compliance with GeoTracker requirements.

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACDEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I have read and acknowledge the content, recommendations and/or conclusions contained in the attached document or report submitted on my behalf to the State Water Board's GeoTracker website." This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

For LUFT cases, RP's non-compliance with these regulations may result in ineligibility to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse the cost of cleanup. AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
