Clearwater Group (Clearwater) is in receipt of your letter dated December 1, 2008, referencing the above-mentioned permit. As of December 29, 2008, Clearwater has not installed the groundwater extraction, treatment, and discharge system at the Naz Eagle Gas Station at 4301 San Leandro Street, Oakland. Therefore, Clearwater has no data to submit in the form of a Semi-Annual Technical Report for the period July 1, 2008, through December 31, 2008.

Clearwater is currently revaluating this site's hydrogeology and contaminant characterization, in order to select the best groundwater remedial alternative and to finalize the remediation compound design. Clearwater wishes to keep the wastewater discharge permit (No. 50586681)



active and will notify EBMUD of any progress toward construction of the permitted remediation compound prior to discharge of any treated groundwater from the site. Please call me at 510-307-9943, Ext. 237 if you have any questions.
