As you may be aware, Atlantic Richfield Company (ARC) has retained the services of Closure Solutions, Inc. in a statewide effort to identify environmental cases that appear to meet the State criteria for low-threat closure. Based on Closure Solutions' review, the above referenced case does not appear to pose a significant threat to human health, environmental receptors, or the reasonably anticipated beneficial uses of water, and a formal No Further Action Request (closure request) was submitted to your office on March 5, 2012.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 23 §2814.6, if an agency does not respond to a closure request within 60 days, the closure request is considered to be in de facto denial. Because of the recent change in Alameda County Environmental Health oversight personnel for this case, ARC respectfully requests that you respond to the closure request by June 22, 2012 or we will consider it de facto denial.
