A review of the Leaking Underground Storage Tank file for the subject site found the latest report to be "Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation Report" dated July 27, 1994, prepared by AllWest Environmental. If this was the only period where a groundwater sample was collected, then, at least an additional sample will need to be collected and analyzed before the site can be closed. The sample is to be analyzed for Methyl Tertiary-Butyl Ether (MTBE), Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as Gasoline (TPH-G), TPH-Diesel (TPH-D), benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene, and xylene (BTEX), Halogenated Volatile Organic Compounds (HVOC)(8260,8240). Please submit a report which describes and documents this activity.

LANDOWNER NOTIFICATION AND PARTICIPATION REQUIREMENTS

Dear Mr. Shirar:

This letter is to inform you of new legislative requirements pertaining to cleanup and closure of sites where an unauthorized release of hazardous substance, including petroleum, has occurred from an underground storage tank (UST). Section 25297.15(a) of Ch. 6.7 of the Health & Safety Code requires the primary or active responsible party to notify all current record owners of fee title to the site of: 1) a site cleanup proposal, 2) a site closure proposal, 3) a local agency intention to make a determination that no further action is required, and 4) a local agency intention to issue a closure letter. Section 25297.15(b) requires the local agency to take all reasonable steps to accommodate responsible landowners' participation in the cleanup or site closure process and to consider their input and recommendations.

For purposes of implementing these sections, you have been identified as the primary or active responsible party. Please provide to this agency, within twenty (20) calendar days of receipt of this notice, a complete mailing list of all current record owners of fee title to the site. You may use the enclosed "list of landowners" form (sample letter 2) as a template to comply with this requirement. If the list of current record owners of fee title to the site changes, you must notify the local agency of the change within 20 calendar days from when you are notified of the change.

If you are the sole landowner, please indicate that on the landowner list form. The following notice requirements do not apply to responsible parties who are the sole landowner for the site.

In accordance with Section 25297.15(a) of Ch. 6.7 of the Health & Safety Code, you must certify to the local agency that all current record owners of fee title to the site have been informed of the proposed action before the local agency may do any of the following:

- 1) consider a cleanup proposal (corrective action plan)
- 2) consider a site closure proposal
- 3) make a determination that no further action is required
- 4) issue a closure letter

You may use the enclosed "notice of proposed action" form (sample letter 3) as a template to comply with this requirement. Before approving a cleanup proposal or site closure proposal, determining that no further action is required, or issuing a closure letter, the local agency will take all reasonable steps necessary to accommodate responsible landowner participation in the cleanup and site closure process and will consider all input and recommendations from any responsible landowner.

Dear Mr. Ching:

I have completed review of All West's January 10, 1994 Work Plan for Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation prepared for the above referenced site. The workplan is acceptable noting the following recommendations/changes:

- 1. Groundwater data collected from nearby sites, 2915 and 3093 Broadway, show groundwater to flow generally to the south, southeasterly direction. The proposed monitoring well should be moved so it is south, southeast of the former underground storage tank pit. Please send a revised site plan showing the new location of the proposed monitoring well.
- 2. After the monitoring well is installed, this well plus two wells from 3093 Broadway should be surveyed to mean sea level. Water elevations measured from these well will be used to calculate gradient and flow direction. wells should be purged and groundwater physical property indicators (temperature, pH, and conductivity) be monitored to verify the wells are screened in the sample aquifer. Future monitoring for groundwater elevation should include the two off-site wells.

Field work should commence within 60 days of the date of this letter. Please notify this office at least 72 hours prior to the start of field activities. If you have any questions, I can be reached at (510) 271-4530.

Dear Mr. Shirar:

I have completed review of Versar's October 15, 1993 Underground Storage Tank (UST) Closure Report for the above referenced site. When a 350 gallon UST was removed, soil samples collected at six feet depth exhibited 130 parts per million total oil and grease (ppm TOG). At eight feet depth there was 140 ppm TOG. Soil staining was observed on the walls and bottom of the pit. The UST had obvious holes.

Clearly a petroleum hydrocarbon release has occurred at this site. At this time, further investigations are required to determine the extent and severity of soil and groundwater contamination which have resulted from the release.

Such an investigation shall be in the form of a **Preliminary Site Assessment**, or PSA. The information gathered by the PSA will be used to determine an appropriate course of action to remediate the site, if deemed necessary. The PSA must be conducted in accordance with the RWQCB <u>Staff Recommendations for the Initial Evaluation and Investigation of Underground Tanks</u>, and Article 11 of Title 23, California Code of Regulations. The major elements of such an investigation are summarized in the attached Appendix A.

The PSA proposal is due within 45 days of the date of this letter. Once the proposal is approved, field work should commence within 60 days. A report must be submitted within 45 days after the completion of this phase of work at the site. Subsequent reports are to be submitted <u>quarterly</u> until this site qualifies for RWQCB "sign off." All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist, Certified Engineering Geologist, or Registered Civil Engineer.

Please be advised that this is a formal request for technical reports pursuant to Title 23, CCR, Section 2722(c). Any extensions of the stated deadlines, or modifications of the required tasks, must be confirmed in writing by either this agency.

Enclosed also is an <u>Underground Storage Tank Unauthorized Release</u> (<u>Leak</u>)/<u>Contamination Site Report</u> which must be completed and returned to this office within 15 days of the date of this letter.
