NOTICE TO COMPLY

Subject: Second Request for Well Destruction at Fuel Leak Case RO0000140 and GeoTracker Global ID T0600101621, Roy Anderson Paints, 3080 Broadway, Oakland, CA 94611

Dear Mr. Shirar:

A review of the case file for the above-referenced site indicates that your case is currently not in compliance with Alameda County Department of Environmental Health's (ACDEH's) March 17, 2017 Directive Letter requesting well destruction by May 19, 2017. You requested an extension on May 22, 2017 and on June 6, 2017 ACDEH extended the deadline for well destruction report to August 4, 2017. It has been nearly 5 months since the report was due, and a report documenting well destruction has not been received by ACDEH or on Geotracker.

Completion of site cleanup at this site and the removal of vertical conduits as preferential pathways is required in order to be protective of human health and the environment and to move this case towards completion and closure. Please note that as a Responsible Party, you are required by California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 11, §2720 through §2728 to characterize the site and implement corrective action.

In order to regain compliance, please undertake well destruction under permit obtained from the Alameda County Department of Public Works, submit a well destruction report, and electronically upload all documents to GeoTracker by the date specified below. Failure to submit the report by the due dates specified below may result in an issuance of a Notice of Violation and possible enforcement action by the District Attorney and/or ineligibility for reimbursement of corrective action costs incurred at the site from the Underground Storage Tank Clean-up Fund. Furthermore, ACDEH may recommend removal of this site from the Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund. Pursuant to Chapter 6.7, California Health and Safety code, civil penalties up to \$10,000 for each UST for each day of violation may be imposed. Once removed from the Clean-up Fund, the costs associated with site characterization/site cleanup work that is required will not be reimbursed. Please note that civil penalties for non-compliance are assessed from the original due date (May 19, 2017).

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Monitoring Well Destruction and Waste Removal Activities – As indicated above, at this time you are requested to decommission the site monitoring well and document the removal of any remaining investigation, remediation, and well destruction derived waste from the site. Please submit a report to document well destruction, and the removal and documented disposal of any remaining associated waste by the date identified below.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
