Dear Responsible Parties:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) has been requesting the destruction of the groundwater monitoring well at this site for at least three and one-half years (copies of previous letters are attached). This site is listed as a Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) site as the result of a leak from a former underground storage tank (UST) which was previously located at the property. This site has been cleaned to the extent required by the State of California. However, without the destruction of the well, ACEH cannot close the case. Therefore we need your assistance.

Why Is This Important to You?

Well destruction and case closure is important for you for the following reasons:

- Generalized stigmas are commonly associated with known contaminated sites.
- Until the case is closed, the property will remain listed in a state database of contaminated sites.
 This generally affects property refinancing to obtain lower rates as lenders are hesitant to loan on a contaminated site.
- Until the case is closed, the property value is generally reduced due to concerns about the extent of residual contamination that may remain at the site. With closure, the extent of contamination is understood to be acceptable and protective of human health and the environment.
- Closed sites generally have higher property values, are sold more quickly, and fewer questions
 are asked about former contamination with the passage of time.

There are standard procedures that need to be met in order to obtain closure, and well destruction is one of them. Please contact me for assistance during this process. The requirements are well understood and are not time consuming.

Additionally, in order to close this case, ACEH is required by the state to verify that all landowners have been informed of the potential case closure in order that these property owners are not surprised by these actions. To that end, ACEH has also attached a *List of Landowners Form* that needs to be filled out by the property owner.

So that you understand that there are legal and financial implications, please be aware that under Chapter 6.7 of the California Health and Safety Code, civil penalties up to \$10,000 for each UST for each day of violation may be imposed. **ACEH would prefer your monies be used for site closure rather than payment of penalty fees.** Please note that civil penalties for non-compliance are assessed from the original due date for a well destruction report (June 4, 2009).

Dear Responsible Parties:

On July 3, 2008 Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff issued a letter requesting that the site be claimed in the State Water Resource Control Board's (SWRCBs) Geotracker database. The first Notice of Violation was issued by ACEH on July 24, 2009, a second Notice of Violation was issued on February 25, 2011, and on March 28, 2012 a third Notice of Violation was issued by ACEH. Each was issued because the site had not been claimed in the SWRCBs Geotracker database. Each letter contained deadlines that have not been met.

Additionally, on March 6, 2009 ACEH requested that existing monitoring wells be decommissioned (destroyed). This request was again contained in the March 28, 2012 directive letter.

A recent review of the case file and the State's GeoTracker database indicate that the wells have not been decommissioned and the site still has not been claimed. Your site is out of compliance with multiple directives from this agency. **Because this agency is tasked by the State to manage these tasks, you are also out of compliance with State requirements.** Again, this letter is an additional attempt to preclude further enforcement actions. Pursuant to State of California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 30, Articles 1 and 2, Sections 3893, 3894, and 3895, you are required to claim your site and subsequently transmit electronic reports and other site data.

In order to regain compliance with local and State requirements, and to move the site towards site closure, please claim the site and submit the documents to both GeoTracker and to ACEH's FTP site by the dates specified below. Failure to submit the documents may additionally result in referral and possible enforcement action by the District Attorney.

A review of the case file and the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) GeoTracker website indicate that the site has not been claimed in the database; therefore electronic copies of analytical and survey data have not been uploaded to the SWRCB GeoTracker database, thus rendering the site to non-compliance status. Pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 16, Article 12, Sections 2729 and 2729.1, beginning September 1, 2001, all analytical data, including monitoring well samples, submitted in a report to a regulatory agency as part of the LUST program, must be transmitted electronically to the SWRCB GeoTracker system via the internet. Additionally, all permanent monitoring points utilized to collected groundwater samples (i.e. monitoring wells) and submitted in a report to a regulatory agency, must be surveyed (top of casing) to mean sea level relative to NGVD88 and latitude and longitude to sub-meter accuracy relative to NAD 83. A California licensed surveyor may be required to perform this work. Lastly, pursuant to California Code of Regulations, Title 23, Division 3, Chapter 30, Articles 1 and 2, Sections 3893, 3894, and 3895, beginning July 1, 2005, the successful submittal of electronic information (i.e. report in PDF format) shall replace the requirement for the submittal of a paper copy.

In order to remain in compliance and maintain eligibility to receive reimbursement for investigation costs from the UST Clean-up Fund, please claim your site, upload all analytical data (EDF), beginning from September 1, 2001 to current, including monitoring well survey data (GEO_XY and GEO_Z), and PDF reports from July 1, 2005 to current to the SWRCB's GeoTracker database website in accordance with the above-cited regulations. Survey the monitoring well(s) (if applicable), perform the electronic submittals, and submit verification to this Agency by AUGUST 15, 2008. Failure to comply with this requirement will result in an issuance of a Notice of Violation and possible forfeiture of reimbursement monies.

Dear Responsible Party(ies):

The purpose of this correspondence is to inform you of changes to groundwater monitoring requirements for all fuel leak cases in California. The California State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board) has approved Resolution No. 2009-0042 (Actions to Improve Administration of the UST Cleanup Fund and UST Cleanup Program). Resolution No. 2009-0042 states that, "Regional Water Board and LOP agencies shall reduce quarterly groundwater monitoring requirements to semiannual or less frequent monitoring at all site unless site-specific needs warrant otherwise and shall notify all responsible parties of the new requirements no later than August 1, 2009. If more than semiannual monitoring is required for a case, the responsible party and State Water board shall be notified of the rationale and the notice shall be posted on Geotracker."

This site is in the process of case closure. Since the monitoring at the site must be property destroyed prior to case closure, the new groundwater monitoring requirements in State Water Board Resolution No. 2009-0042 do not affect you at this time. These new groundwater monitoring requirements potentially may apply if monitoring wells are installed at your site in the future.

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.
