Exchanged phone messages and finally spoke with Chuck Ditmar, consultant with ARCADIS, re RO1389- GM Truck Center. Our conversation revolved around the previous site activities and potential future activities. Mr. Ditmar indicated cleanup actions at the site included over excavation of impacted areas, including the former tank pits. I mentioned the ACEH ftp site was missing reports such as the tank removal report, remedial action reports, and GWM reports predating 2011. Few if any reports have been uploaded to Geotracker. Mr. Ditmar said he would review the ACEH case file and upload missing documents to the extent he could locate them. I said our current case file documents a lot of poking holes in the ground but little remedial action. He knew remedial actions have taken place and replied he would provide documentation of the remedial actions.

Mr. Ditmar said the site was a lowland in-filled by Caltrans and that he could not document the source of the fill, but was referenced in a 2009 report. ACEH does not have reports for 2009. I mentioned the tidal/drainage channels abutting the site had demonstrated impacts and these channels feed directly into the estuary. These impacts were ignored by the RBCA prepared for the site and should be addressed.

I requested RP contact information and coordination of groundwater monitoring events with the adjoining Hegenberger Caltrans site. Mr. Ditmar provided the contact info and agreed to coordinate groundwater measurements but not anything else.
