The health risk assessment completed to date indicates that based on the assumptions that 1 liter (approximately four 8-ounce cups) of groundwater from your well would be consumed on a daily basis for 35 years, there is no significant increase in risk. Although it is our understanding that your well is used exclusively for irrigation purposes, the May 13, 1992 letter indicated that the risk assessment was being reviewed by the ACHCS and that based on their review, ACHCS may recommend that use of your well be curtailed.

The ACHCS has solicited ARCO to take the lead in requesting that use of your well be temporarily discontinued. Therefore, ARCO requests that use of your well be discontinued for approximately 6 months to at least August 1, 1993, until ACHCS has completed their review of the risk assessment, and determined whether pumping of your well has an effect on the migration of the gasoline components found in the groundwater.
