I wanted to followup on three LOP (Local Oversight Program) cases and one SCP (Site Cleanup Program) case that ACEH has with the City of Emeryville. We recently issued letters on these cases in an effort to restart movement towards closure under the state's new Low-Threat Closure Policy (LTCP), and were in part requesting a meeting in order to discuss the sites. I recalled mid process that you had wanted to be notified (at least for potential case closures) and that closure notifications should be addressed to you rather than Markus Niebanck.
