As you may be aware, Atlantic Richfield Company (ARC) has retained the services of Closure Solutions, Inc. in a statewide effort to identify environmental cases that appear to meet the State criteria for low-threat closure. Based on Closure Solutions' review, the above referenced case does not appear to pose a significant threat to human health, environmental receptors, or the reasonably anticipated beneficial uses of water, and a formal No Further Action Request (closure request) was submitted to your office on January 21, 2011.

Pursuant to California Code of Regulations (CCR) Title 23 §2814.6, if an agency does not respond to a closure request within 60 days, the closure request is considered to be in de facto denial. Because of this, ARC respectfully requests that you respond to the closure request by March 22, 2011 or it will be considered de facto denial.
