I am following up on submittal dates for deliverables identified in the February 1st meeting for the environmental investigation for the former Chevron service station at 3026 Lakeshore. Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) has heard from Chevron and their consultant that they encountered delivery problems with FEDEX in getting samples to their laboratory, and that the imminent Human Health Risk Assessment analysis will be a week late (moving from March 9th to March 16th). An extension to that date has been provided due to issues outside of their control.

ACDEH has not heard from the Diocese's team in regards to the Storm Water Infiltration Investigation deliverable which was also due March 9th. If problems outside of your control have developed, please request an extension based on that data / reason. If not please submit the report or make ACDEH aware of the anticipated time frame for the submittal of the report.
