Good afternoon Kit.

Thank you for your review of the work plan to collect soil samples in the vicinity of the oil/water separator at the Owens-Brockway Glass facility at 3600 Alameda Avenue in Oakland. When the work plan was written we thought that it would be possible to install the borings, collect the data, and include the results in the Soil Vapor Investigation report due on March 31, 2017. Given that its already March 16, it is now nearly impossible obtain the drilling permit, schedule the driller and complete the work in time to include the report as an appendix. We have two options that you may want to consider.

1) Complete the work and submit the report as a stand alone document at a later date in April (suggest April 28).

or;

2) Extend the due date for the Soil Vapor report to April 28 and include the soil investigation in that document as originally planned.
