Being new to the case and having taken a quick review of the site data, I think the site is probably closeable. However, I have not had a chance to review the data and prepare a closure package. I have also realized that the document has not been submitted to either GeoTracker or to the County's website and technically ACEH has 60 days after acceptance of the document. Please submit the document to both websites as required and I will review it.

At this time the "streamlined closure process" that you reference is technically an internal working document that has not been approved for use by consultants or regulators.
