On behalf of Chevron Environmental Management Company's (EMC's) affiliate, Union Oil Company of California ("Union Oil"), AECOM is pleased to submit this well destruction report for the above-referenced site (**Figure 1**). Well destruction was approved by Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) as the final condition for closure of the environmental case in a letter issued on June 4, 2015 (**Attachment A**).

Pre-field Activities

AECOM prepared a site-specific health and safety plan (HASP) to address potential physical and chemical hazards associated with the scope of work performed at the site. All work conducted by AECOM and any subcontractors was performed in general accordance with the HASP. AECOM notified ACEH, Alameda County Public Works Agency (ACPW), the City of Oakland, and Underground Service Alert of Northern California (USA North) at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of fieldwork. On June 3, 2015, AECOM oversaw Cruz Brothers Locators, Inc. of Santa Cruz, California, a private utility survey company, provide additional underground utility location and clearance services prior to well destruction, and verify markings associated with the USA North notification.

A well destruction permit was obtained from ACPW for all wells prior to being destroyed. Traffic control, obstruction, and excavation permits were obtained through the City of Oakland prior to the well destruction activities for monitoring wells MW-8 and MW-9 that were located within the city sidewalk along Fruitvale Avenue (**Figure 2**). All permits are included in **Attachment B**.

Field Activities

On June 23 and 24, 2015, AECOM oversaw Confluence Environmental Inc. (Confluence) (State C-57 license #913194) properly destroy all nine site wells by pressure grouting techniques in general accordance with California Department of Water Resources (DWR) regulations (**Figure 2**). An ACPW inspector was on site during each day of the well destruction activities to perform a grout inspection.

The wells were pressure grouted by placing cement grout from the bottom of the well and filled to the surface using a 1-inch tremie pipe. The well was then pressurized to 25 pounds per square inch for 5 minutes to ensure that the well and filter pack was sealed with grout. Then, the grout was topped off if settling occurred. At on-site locations MW-1 through MW-7, the well box and well pad were removed, the top 1-foot of well casing was cut off, and each location was completed with cement to match the existing

surface. At off-site locations MW-8 and MW-9 the well box and the upper 5-feet of well casing and annulus were removed and backfilled with native type material per ACPW requirements. For the off-site wells located within the City of Oakland sidewalk, the entire panel of concrete was removed and replaced per the city excavation permit requirements (**Attachment B**).

No waste was generated during the well destruction activities. Clean construction debris (metal and concrete) was removed and recycled by Confluence.

DWR well destruction reports are included in **Attachment C** and will be sent to DWR per well permit requirements.

Conclusion

The well destruction activities were the final requirement to satisfy site closure. A letter of no further action letter is anticipated, pending the final upload of this report documenting well destruction activities.

Figure 2 – Site Plan








SITE LOCATION MAP

The public comment period for the subject site ended on June 3, 2015. No comments were received by Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH).

You are free to proceed with the destruction of all wells associated with the site (groundwater, vapor, etc), as requested in the ACEH correspondence dated May 5, 2015. If not already permitted, please contact the Alameda County Public Works Agency to obtain well destruction permits. Following the well destruction, please provide ACEH with a well destruction report according to the schedule outlined below. The well destruction report should document site activities, provide well destruction permit documentation, and documentation indicating that any remaining investigation, remediation, and well destruction derived waste have been removed from the site. The State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCBs) Well Destruction and Waste Removal Requirements fact sheet is included as an attachment.

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the **SWRCB** website for these requirements more information (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/).

PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
 document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. <u>Documents</u>
 with password protection will not be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password

Well Destruction and Waste Removal Requirements Prior to Underground Storage Tank Case Closure

Background: Proper destruction of wells helps to protect groundwater from potential threats and is a critical component of the Underground Storage Tank (UST) case closure process. The Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank (UST) Case Closure Policy (Policy) mandates that monitoring wells be properly destroyed prior to UST case closure, unless they will be kept and maintained in accordance with applicable local and state requirements. The Policy also mandates that all investigation and remediation-derived waste materials be removed prior to case closure. As of May 15, 2015, there were a total of 836 "Open-Eligible for Closure" cases throughout California, for which remaining wells and wastes served as impediments to closure.

Information for Responsible Parties and

Site Owners: If you received a letter from the State Water Resources Control Board (State Water Board), Regional Water Quality Control Board, or a local agency directing well destruction and waste removal, you must take action before your UST case can be closed. A uniform closure letter (UCL) will not be issued for your case until

Note: The State Water Board has the authority to administratively impose civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per day per UST on responsible parties and site owners that fail to comply with the requirements of UST case closure order. Do not let penalties be imposed on you!

the wastes are removed and the wells are either destroyed or approved for continued maintenance by the regulatory agency overseeing your UST case. Your local well permitting agency may require ongoing monitoring of wells even though the regulatory agency is not requiring it, so additional costs may be incurred. A list of open cases with directives to destroy wells and remove wastes can be viewed on the public GeoTracker webpage at: http://geotracker.waterboards.ca.gov/ptcp destruction report.asp.

The contractor that helped you with corrective actions at your site can provide more information about the well destruction and waste removal process. If you do not currently have

a contractor, you can contact the regulatory agency that is responsible for oversight of your UST case and ask if they have a list of contractors in the area. Your regulatory agency can also let you know if your contractor is required to submit a work plan for approval before well destruction and waste removal begins. Once the work is complete, submit confirmation documentation to the regulatory agency overseeing your UST case. After the well and waste

removal has been completed, approved by your regulatory agency, and communicated to the State Water Board, a UCL will be issued and uploaded to GeoTracker.

If you have an eligible claim with the UST Cleanup Fund, the cost of well destruction is considered corrective action and reasonable and necessary costs are typically reimbursable. Monitoring of wells after you have been informed that the wells should be destroyed is not normally considered to be corrective action and may not be eligible for reimbursement. 
Specific Work Permit Conditions

- 1. Drilling Permit(s) can be voided/ cancelled only in writing. It is the applicant's responsibility to notify Alameda County Public Works Agency, Water Resources Section in writing for an extension or to cancel the drilling permit application. No drilling permit application(s) shall be extended beyond ninety (90) days from the original start date. Applicants may not cancel a drilling permit application after the completion date of the permit issued has passed.
- 2. Prior to any drilling activities, it shall be the applicant's responsibility to contact and coordinate an Underground Service Alert (USA), obtain encroachment permit(s), excavation permit(s) or any other permits or agreements required for that Federal, State, County or City, and follow all City or County Ordinances. No work shall begin until all the permits

and requirements have been approved or obtained. It shall also be the applicants responsibilities to provide to the Cities or to Alameda County an Traffic Safety Plan for any lane closures or detours planned. No work shall begin until all the permits and requirements have been approved or obtained.

- 3. Compliance with the well-sealing specifications shall not exempt the well-sealing contractor from complying with appropriate State reporting-requirements related to well construction or destruction (Sections 13750 through 13755 (Division 7, Chapter 10, Article 3) of the California Water Code). Contractor must complete State DWR Form 188 and mail original to the Alameda County Public Works Agency, Water Resources Section, within 60 days. Include permit number and site map.
- 4. Applicant shall submit the copies of the approved encroachment permit to this office within 10 days.
- 5. Permittee shall assume entire responsibility for all activities and uses under this permit and shall indemnify, defend and save the Alameda County Public Works Agency, its officers, agents, and employees free and harmless from any and all expense, cost and liability in connection with or resulting from the exercise of this Permit including, but not limited to, property damage, personal injury and wrongful death.
- 6. Applicant shall contact assigned inspector listed on the top of the permit at least five (5) working days prior to starting, once the permit has been approved. Confirm the scheduled date(s) at least 24 hours prior to drilling.
- 7. Permittee, permittee's contractors, consultants or agents shall be responsible to assure that all material or waters generated during drilling, boring destruction, and/or other activities associated with this Permit will be safely handled, properly managed, and disposed of according to all applicable federal, state, and local statutes regulating such. In no case shall these materials and/or waters be allowed to enter, or potentially enter, on or off-site storm sewers, dry wells, or waterways or be allowed to move off the property where work is being completed.
- 8. Remove the Christy box or similar structure. Destroy wells MW-8 and Mw-9 by overdrilling the upper 5ft. below ground surface (bgs) and then tremie grouting with neat cement. Allow the sealing material to spill over the top of the casing to fill any annular space between casing and soil. After the seal has set, backfill the remaining hole by approved encroachment permit concrete material and asphalt material by Caltrans Spec or County/City Codes.
- 9. Remove the Christy box or similar structure. Destroy wells MW-1 to MW-7 by grouting neat cement with a tremie pipe or pressure grouting (25 psi for 5min.) to the bottom of the well and by filling with neat cement to three (3-5) feet below surface grade. Allow the sealing material to spill over the top of the casing to fill any annular space between casing and soil. After the seal has set, backfill the remaining hole with concrete or compacted material to match existing conditions.
- 10. Copy of approved drilling permit must be on site at all times. Failure to present or show proof of the approved permit application on site shall result in a fine of \$500.00.

ADD NEW SUBSECTION TO READ: SP 7-10.1.4 Vehicular Traffic

Attention is directed to Section 7-10. Public Convenience and Safety, of the City of Oakland Standard Specification for Public Works Construction, 2006 Edition (Include this paragraph for p-jobs, excavation permits or obstruction permits).

The Contractor shall conduct its work in such a manner as to provide public convenience and safety and according to the provisions in this subsection. The provisions shall not be modified or altered without written approval from the Engineer.

Standard traffic control devices shall be placed at the construction zone according to the latest edition of the <u>Work Area Traffic Control Handbook</u> or <u>Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD)</u>, <u>Chapter 6</u> – "Traffic Controls for Construction and Maintenance Work Zone," or as directed by the Engineer.

All trenches and excavations in any public street or roadway shall be back filled and opened to traffic, or covered with suitable steel plates securely placed and opened to traffic at all times except during actual construction operations unless otherwise permitted by the Engineer.

Each section of work shall be completed or temporarily paved and open to traffic in not more than 5 days after commencing work unless otherwise permitted in writing by the Engineer.

Where construction encroaches into the sidewalk area, a minimum of 5 ½ feet of unobstructed sidewalk shall be maintained at all times for pedestrian use. Pedestrian barricades, shelter, and detour signs per Caltrans standards may be required.

The contractor shall conduct its operation in such a manner as to leave the following traffic lanes unobstructed and in a condition satisfactory for vehicular travel during the Obstruction Period. At all times traffic lanes will be restricted and reopened to travel. Emergency access shall be provided at all times.





Figure 6H-6. Shoulder Work with Minor Encroachment (TA-6)
