Dear Ms. McKerroll and Mr. Davis:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the above-referenced fuel leak case file for proposed case closure pursuant to California Health and Safety Code (H&SC) Section 25296.10 and the State Water Board's Low-Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy (LTCP). Based on our review, ACDEH has determined that the site appears to qualify for case closure and therefore, no further action related to the underground storage tank fuel release is required at this time. ACDEH has sent out the enclosed public participation fact sheet (*Attachment 1*), which describes the site and the proposed case closure. Public comments on the proposed case closure will be accepted for a period of sixty (60) days beginning Monday, July 23, 2018 through Friday, September 21, 2018 Following the public comment period, the comments received, will be reviewed and considered prior to issuance of the Remedial Action Completion Certificate.

Prior to case closure you must complete the following actions:

- 1. Notify all current record owners of fee title to the site in accordance with H&SC 25297.15;
- 2. Properly destroy all groundwater [and/or] vapor monitoring wells in accordance with California Water Code and Alameda County Ordinance Code 6.88 under permit by the well permitting agency; and
- 3. Remove all waste piles, drums, debris and other investigation or remediation derived material in accordance with State laws.

Action Items 2 and 3 listed above are further addressed in the State Water Board Fact Sheet. Therefore at this juncture, ACDEH requests that you address the following comments, perform the proposed work, and submit the documents requested below by the associated compliance dates. Upon completion of the public comment period and receipt of the requisite documents, ACDEH will close the case and issue a Remedial Action Completion Certificate.

COMMENTS

1. <u>Landowner Notification Form</u> – Pursuant to H&SC Section 25297.15, ACDEH shall not consider cleanup or site closure proposals from the primary or active responsible party, issue a closure letter, or make a determination that no further action is required with respect to a site upon which there was an

unauthorized release of hazardous substances from an underground storage tank subject to H&SC Chapter 6.7 unless the primary or active responsible party has notified all current record owners of fee title to the site of the proposed action.

To satisfy this requirement, please complete the List of Landowners Form (*Attachment 2*) and mail it back to ACDEH by the compliance date listed below.

- Submittal of Landowner Notification Form Tuesday, August 7, 2018
- 2. Monitoring Well Destruction All groundwater and soil vapor monitoring wells must be properly destroyed under permit by the appropriate well permitting agency. In order to expedite the case closure process, ACDEH requests that you initiate the well destruction permitting process upon receipt of this letter by contacting Zone 7 Water Agency at (925) 454-5000 to obtain the necessary permits. Please note however, that monitoring well destruction cannot be conducted until after the public notification period is completed and well destruction is approved by ACDEH.

To satisfy this requirement, please submit a table to ACDEH via email correspondence listing the status of all historic site wells (i.e., destroyed, lost, remaining) and copies of well permits for destruction of the remaining wells, and complete the destruction of remaining wells by the compliance dates listed below.

- Well Status Information and Well Destruction Permits Friday, September 21, 2018
- Well Destruction Monday, October 8, 2018
- 3. <u>Waste Removal</u> All investigation and remediation derived materials must be removed from the site and properly disposed of at an appropriate designated facility in accordance with applicable State laws.

To satisfy this requirement, please complete waste removal activities by the compliance date listed below.

- Waste Removal Monday, October 8, 2018
- Well Destruction and Waste Removal Report Prepare a report documenting well destruction and waste removal activities. The report must include the well status table, well destruction permits, and waste manifests.

To satisfy this requirement, please submit the report to the State Water Board's GeoTracker website in accordance the compliance date listed below.



The above referenced site is a fuel leak case that is under the regulatory oversight of the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Local Oversight Program for the investigation and cleanup of a release of petroleum hydrocarbons from an underground storage tank system. REPORT & DELIVERABLE REQUESTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACDEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I have read and acknowledge the content, recommendations and/or conclusions contained in the attached document or report submitted on my behalf to the State Water Board's GeoTracker website." This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
