Subject: Case File Review for Fuel Leak Case No. RO0000343 and Geotracker Global ID T0600101263, Shell, 461 8th Street, Oakland, CA 94607

Dear Mr. Brown, Mr. Spivey, and Mr. Ward:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the fuel leak case file for the above-referenced site including the recently submitted documents entitled, "*Sump Sampling Report*," dated April 13, 2011, "*Groundwater Monitoring and Remediation Report - Fourth Quarter 2010*," dated February 14, 2011, and "*Groundwater Monitoring and Remediation Report - First Quarter 2011*," dated April 13, 2011. All reports were prepared on Shell's behalf by Conestoga-Rovers & Associates. The Sump Sampling Report presents results from sampling of three off-site sumps. The groundwater monitoring reports present groundwater sampling results and an evaluation and recommendations regarding in-situ chemical oxidation (ISCO) injections.

We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work. and send us the reports described below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. **Sump Sampling.** Water samples were collected from two sumps in the basement of the Oakland Police Department building and one sump in the BART tunnel below the corner of 7th Avenue and Broadway. Sumps in the basements of two parking garages east of Broadway could not be accessed for sampling. Petroleum hydrocarbons were not detected in the water sample from the BART tunnel and one of the two water samples collected from the Oakland Police Department building (SUMP-OPD-2). Total petroleum hydrocarbons as gasoline and benzene were detected at concentrations of 93 and 8 micrograms per liter, respectively, in the second water sample (SUMP-OPD-1) collected from a sump at the Oakland Police Department. No further sampling of the sumps is requested at this time.

2. **Future Groundwater Monitoring.** Future groundwater monitoring is to be conducted on a quarterly basis consistent with the monitoring conducted prior to the ISCO treatments. However, based on the detection of an elevated concentration of sulfate detected in the in the sump sample collected from the BART tube, we request an additional round of sulfate analysis in water samples collected from downgradient monitoring wells. Specifically, we request that groundwater samples collected during the second quarter 2011 from wells S-5, S-6, S-13, S-20, S-21A, and S-22S be analyzed for sulfate. Please include a table showing the sulfate sampling results in the second quarter 2011 Groundwater Monitoring Report requested below.
3. **Site Assessment.** This site was also discussed during a meeting held on February 17, 2011 between Mr. Denis Brown of Shell Oil Products, Mr. Peter Schaefer of Conestoga-Rovers & Associates, and Mr. Jerry Wickham of ACEH. Based on our review of the case file and discussions during the February 17, 2011 meeting, we request that you conduct an additional assessment that includes soil vapor sampling in areas of known or suspected soil contamination outside the source area excavation and the piping and dispenser areas. Please present plans to conduct the soil vapor sampling in the Work Plan requested below.

Responsible Party(ies) Legal Requirements / Obligations

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website for more information on these requirements (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/).

PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

The Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- **Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.**
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as **a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.**
- It is **preferable** that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- **Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.**
- **Do not password protect the document.** Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. **Documents with password protection will not be accepted.**
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#_Report Name_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555_WorkPlan_2005-06-14)

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
 - a) Contact the Alameda County Environmental Health Department to obtain a User Name and Password to upload files to the ftp site.
 - i) Send an e-mail to deh.loptoxic@acgov.org
 - b) In the subject line of your request, be sure to include "**ftp PASSWORD REQUEST**" and in the body of your request, include the **Contact Information, Site Addresses,** and the **Case Numbers (RO# available in Geotracker) you will be posting for.**
- 2) Upload Files to the ftp Site
 - a) Using Internet Explorer (IE4+), go to <ftp://alcoftp1.acgov.org>
 - (i) Note: Netscape, Safari, and Firefox browsers will not open the FTP site as they are NOT being supported at this time.
 - b) Click on Page located on the Command bar on upper right side of window, and then scroll down to Open FTP Site in Windows Explorer.
 - c) Enter your User Name and Password. (Note: Both are Case Sensitive.)
 - d) Open "My Computer" on your computer and navigate to the file(s) you wish to upload to the ftp site.
 - e) With both "My Computer" and the ftp site open in separate windows, drag and drop the file(s) from "My Computer" to the ftp window.
- 3) Send E-mail Notifications to the Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs

 - b) Copy your Caseworker on the e-mail. Your Caseworker's e-mail address is the entire first name then a period and entire last name @acgov.org. (e.g., firstname.lastname@acgov.org)

 - d) If your document meets the above requirements and you follow the submission instructions, you will receive a notification by email indicating that your document was successfully uploaded to the ftp site.
