The California Department of Transportation has just informed me that Stanton Avenue will undergo construction shortly. Due to this road work RS-9 would end up in the their right of way, which is against Cal. Trans. policy. RS-9 can be moved to meet Cal. Trans. policy and your request for an off-site well location. This well can be located at or just above Thrifty Oil station's northern boundary (Figure 4). This would put it outside of the construction area.

The sanitary district verbally confirmed approval of the discharge permit today. Final conditions will be sent to Thrifty Oil Co., who must sign to acknowledge the conditions of operation. The system will be started up as soon as possible.






