Dear Mr. Hetrick, and Mr. and Ms. Hinkley:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the *Groundwater Monitoring Well Installation Report*, dated June 29, 2015, the *Monthly Remedial Progress Report – July 2015*, dated September 22, 2015, and the *Third Quarter 2015 Groundwater Monitoring and Sampling Report*, dated September 24, 2015. The reports were prepared and submitted on your behalf by Conestoga-Rovers & Associates (CRA), or the successor company, GHD Services, Inc (GHD). Thank you for submitting the reports.

ACEH has previously evaluated the data presented in the above-mentioned report, in conjunction with case files, to determine if the site is eligible for closure as a low risk site under the State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCBs) Low Threat Underground Storage Tank Case Closure Policy (LTCP). Based on ACEH staff review, we have determined that the site fails to meet the LTCP Media-Specific Criteria for Groundwater and the Media-Specific Criteria for Vapor Intrusion to Indoor Air.

Based on the review of the case file ACEH requests that you address the following technical comments and send us the documents requested below.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Remediation System Repair – The referenced Monthly Remedial Progress Report for month of July 2015 indicates the vapor phase portion of the Dual Phase Extraction (DPE) system has been inoperative since July 4, 2015. The referenced site investigation report documents the installation of groundwater monitoring well C-17 downgradient of the site and within approximately 75 feet of Crow Creek. Recent concentrations up to 2,300 micrograms per liter (µg/l) Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as gasoline (TPHg), and 11 µg/l benzene have been detected in groundwater collected from the well. As you are likely aware, the San Francisco Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) has promulgated Environmental Screening Levels (ESLs) for fresh water ecologic goals that are generally considered to be safe. The fresh water aquatic ESL for TPHg is 500 µg/l, and for benzene it is 46 µg/l. Additionally, data from June 2015 (Table 4, *Monthly Remedial Progress Report – June 2015*, dated August 11, 2015) indicates a significant increase in the rate of removal in the vapor extraction portion of the DPE system for tabulated compounds over previous monthly removal rate totals (TPHg, benzene, MTBE, and total VOCs).

Based on available data, it appears appropriate to prioritize system repair. Therefore, by the date identified below, please communicate the status of system repairs and the scheduled restart of the vapor portion of the DPE system.

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2. Groundwater Monitoring – In order to gather groundwater data quickly, please continue to conduct quarterly groundwater monitoring of well C-17, and the current observed groundwater monitoring schedule for the remaining wells. Please submit groundwater monitoring reports by the dates indicated below.

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please SWRCB visit the website for more information on these requirements (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water issues/programs/ust/electronic submittal/).

PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

The Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please <u>do not</u> submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. Documents with password protection <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
