ACDEH has been concerned that there is a potential for direct-exposure of aquatic biota to elevated total petroleum hydrocarbons as diesel (TPHd) and gasoline (TPHg) detected in borings and monitoring wells located within 10 feet of the top of the earthen bank of an Alameda County Flood Control drainage channel, leading to Seminary Creek and the San Francisco Bay. After submittal of Stantec's December 1, 2016 Ecological Risk Assessment, AECOM provided the third party review in the July 10, 2017 Technical Review. For the terrestrial portion of the site, AECOM was in agreement that there are no potentially complete pathways; however, AECOM stated there may exist potentially complete pathways via shallow site groundwater discharge to the aquatic habitats that border the site, but their significance could not be determined. AECOM's *Technical Review* included recommendations on quantifying the significance of the site shallow groundwater discharge pathway.

TECHNICAL COMMENT

1. Request for Third Party Review of Revised Risk Assessment: ACDEH's staff does not include a toxicologist. Consequently, we request that you submit the August 11, 2017 Revised Ecological Risk Assessment to Usha Vedagiri, AECOM, Oakland, CA, for review and preparation of a Technical Review to confirm that the Revised Ecological Risk Assessment is adequately comprehensive to clarify the existence of a threat to aquatic biota and aquatic habitat. Please submit review findings by the date requested below.

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health's (ACDEH) Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program File Transfer Protocol (FTP) site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to SCP sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/) for more information on these requirements.

Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the
 document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. <u>Documents</u>
 with password protection will not be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.

Submission Instructions
