Dear Responsible Parties:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file and is authorizing the destruction of the on-site wells associated with the groundwater monitoring well network for the subject case. The offsite wells will remain for continued monitoring in order to evaluate the effectiveness of the remedial actions implemented as part of site redevelopment activities.

ACDEH understands redevelopment activities will include the demolition of the existing service station, removal of the underground storage tanks (USTs) and implementation of remedial activities, including removal of free product if found to be present, excavation of soil containing elevated-concentration petroleum hydrocarbons, and application of in-situ chemical oxidation (ISCO) compound(s). We understand soil excavation and ISCO application may be affected by the proximity of the BART right-of way.

ACDEH requests submittal of the report documenting well destruction and the report documenting UST removals and remedial activities as requested below. Please document station decommissioning activities in the UST and remediation report.

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

<u>Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases</u>

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

This letter must be signed by the Responsible Party, or legally authorized representative of the Responsible Party.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

Significant delays in conducting site assessment/cleanup or report submittals may result in referral of the case to the Regional Water Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
