Dear Mr. Seery:

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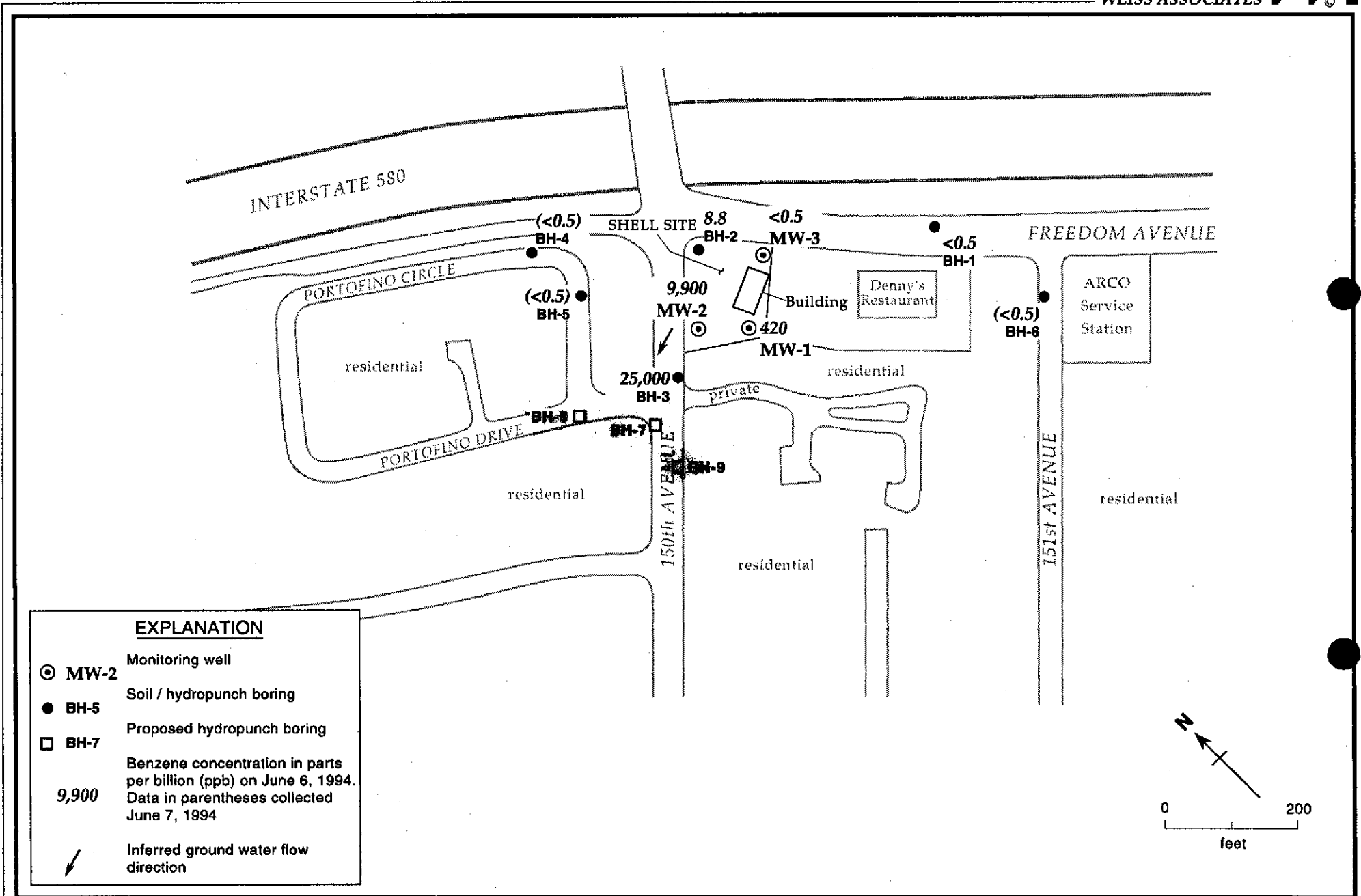


Figure 1. Proposed Hydropunch Locations and Benzene Concentrations in Ground Water - June 6 and 7, 1994 - Shell Service Station WIC #204-6852-1404, 1784 150th Avenue, San Leandro, California

Weiss Associates (WA) is in receipt of your letter to Mr. Dan Kirk of Shell Oil Company (Shell) dated October 24, 1994, regarding the recent investigation activities at the subject site. As outlined in WA's December 6, 1993 workplan<sup>1</sup>, the investigation objective was to fully characterize the extent of hydrocarbons in ground water both upgradient and downgradient of the Shell site. WA, on behalf of Shell, will conduct another phase of hydropunch investigation to assess the extent of hydrocarbons in ground water downgradient of the Shell site. WA proposes to drill three hydropunch borings (BH-7 through BH-9) at the locations shown in Figure 1. WA will conduct this hydropunch sampling phase in the manner described in the December 6, 1993 workplan. Work will begin as soon as we receive your authorization to proceed and the drilling contractor is scheduled.

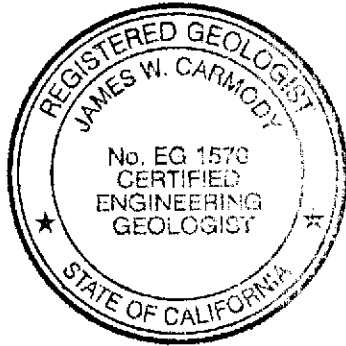
