Approval of Health Risk Assessment Dated December 1, 1997

Dear Ms. Cappio:

The City of Emeryville Building and Planning Department requested Mr. Ron Silberman to secure a letter from the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) indicating that potential health risks associated with his proposed residential development at 1421 Park Avenue in Emeryville were acceptable. SOMA Corporation (SOMA) prepared and submitted a risk assessment report to ACDEH dated December 1, 1997 for the site. The risk assessment was based on the use of two different approaches that were performed in parallel to estimate risk. Each of the two methods is conservative in its approach to transport modeling and risk estimation. The input parameters used by SOMA to describe the Site and the nature of inhalation exposure evaluations are considered to be very conservative. The use of the two models resulted in very discrepant estimates of carcinogenic risk. SOMA has effectively demonstrated the level of uncertainty inherent in the methods. ACDEH finds SOMA's risk assessment report to be well-prepared.

Due to the uncertainties inherent in the estimates of risk for the Site, Mr. Silberman has elected to implement a risk management strategy by installing a vapor barrier beneath the new building foundation. Detailed specifications for the vapor barrier provided by Mr. Silberman were included in SOMA's Addendum to the Project Plans, (December 10, 1997). Assuming Electro-Coatings Inc.'s ongoing remediation of groundwater will continue until the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB) determines that remediation is complete, the importance of the vapor barrier for risk mitigation will diminish with time.

ACDEH in conjunction with the RWQCB staff toxicologist, Mr. Ravi Arulanantham have approved SOMA's risk assessment report of December 1, 1997. Based on the results of the risk assessment, Mr. Silberman's installation of vapor barrier, and Electro-Coatings, Inc.'s continued remediation of the site, ACDEH and the RWQCB staff toxicologist determine that no further action is warranted at this time.

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Environmental Protection Division has completed review of the revised Project Plan for Commercial Property Development dated June 20, 1997, prepared and submitted by Soma Corporation for the above referenced site.

The revised project plan for commercial use of the site is conditionally approved pending review and final approval of the risk assessment and risk management plan. In addition, the following items should be addressed:

- 1. The footprint of the building structure was superimposed over the hexavalent chromium plume. TCE and DCE plumes should also be superimposed.
- Solvent vapor resistant barrier membrane should be used and manufacturer's product information should be submitted. Maintenance plan for the vapor barrier should be included in the risk management plan.
- 3. The health and safety plan for construction activities at the site must include the presence of chlorinated solvent contamination (TCE and DCE) on site in addition to the hexavalent chromium plume. Page 4, section 3.3 should also include the remediation of the chlorinated solvents.
- 4. TCE up to 17,000 ppb and 1,2 DCE up to 11,000 ppb were detected in groundwater during the last sampling event conducted on 4/7/97. Please include these latest concentration data in the health and safety plan (see pages 8 and 12). Section 5.1.1 of the health and safety plan lists the highest TCE and hexavalent chromium detected on-site near the area where the commercial building will be sited. The highest TCE found in MW-10 was 14,000 ppb (not 11,000 ppb). Hexavalent chromium found in MW-5 at 160,000 ppb and MW-14 at 100,000 ppb should be included in the list on page 9.

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Environmental Protection Division has completed review of the limited site investigation work plan dated May 1, 1997 and the underground tank closure plan (closure-in-place of two underground storage tanks) prepared and submitted by Soma Corporation for the above referenced site. We received both plans on 5/2/97.

This office has the following comments regarding the limited site investigation work plan and the underground tank closure plan:

- 1) Closure-in-place for the two USTs and the inert material to be used to fill the USTs must be approved by the City of Emeryville Fire Department.
- 2) Contractors performing the removal / closure of the USTs must have a current operating license from the State Contractors License Board.
- 3) Page 6 of the Underground Tank Closure Plan must be signed by the contractor removing and closing the USTs.
- 4) Stockpiled / excavated soil generated during the closure of the USTs must be characterized for proper disposal. Any reuse of excavated soil at the site must be approved by this agency. Please make the necessary changes on page 4 of the work plan (last sentence) that the excavated soil will characterize and approve by this agency prior to reuse at the site.
- 5) All pipings associated with the USTs must be removed and /or permanently capped.
- 6) At a minimum, one soil sample and one groundwater sample from the borings must be analyzed for hexavalent chromium and chlorinated solvents.

- 7) Page 12 of the workplan should be revised to reflect an updated time schedule.

The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Environmental Protection Division has completed review of the Soil and Groundwater Investigation Work Plan dated February 13, 1995 and prepared by Geraghty & Miller, Inc. for the referenced site. I received a facsimile of the work plan on February 15, 1995. This office is also in receipt of a report prepared by Entrix, entitled Summary of Site Conditions at Electro-Coatings Inc. 1401 and 1421 Park Avenue Emeryville, California (October 28, 1994).

Based on this review, the work plan is acceptable to this office provided the following issues are addressed:

- 1) Page 2 of the work plan discussing the site conditions indicated that the TCE lower concentrations extended approximately 100 feet east/northeast of MW-16. Review of the groundwater data showed the TCE lower concentrations extended approximately 300 feet west/northwest of MW-16. Please clarify this discrepancy.
- 2) A site specific health and safety plan must be submitted to this office.
- 3) Monitoring wells MW-11 and MW-13 shall be included in the sampling program to establish some baseline data of the existing groundwater contamination at the site.
- 4) Groundwater samples from all the wells with the exception of MW-3B must be analyzed for the following target compounds: total chromium, hexavalent chromium, and for purgeable halocarbons. Monitoring wells MW-4, MW-5, MW-8, MW-10, MW-15, and MW-16 must also be analyzed for total petroleum hydrocarbon (TPH) fuel fingerprinting and purgeable aromatics.

5) Two underground fuel storage tanks located west of 1421 Park Avenue in the parking area are subject to permanent closure requirements. The integrity of the tanks must be determined. Please clarify if these tanks are filled with sand or empty. A site map indicating the location of the two underground fuel storage tanks shall be submitted to this office.

- 6) The presence of nickel in the soil and groundwater must be investigated specifically in the nickel plating area. During two site inspections conducted by our office on 12/6/94 and 1/25/95, a sump in the process manifold area contained liquid with a pH of 0-1, indicating strong acid conditions. The threat or impact of these releases to soil and groundwater must be determined.
- 7) Please submit a time schedule of the soil and groundwater investigation / remediation at the site.
- 8) Please notify this office 72 hours in advance of any field activities so I can arrange a site visit.

The work plan must be implemented in a timely fashion. In order to establish the groundwater flow direction in the area, you may need to coordinate water elevation measurements with the neighboring sites located at 1461 Park Avenue and 1400 Park Avenue.

The issues mentioned above (particularly #1 and #6) had been discussed with Mr. Sum Arigala of the San Francisco RWQCB.

A report must be submitted to this agency within 45 days after workplan implementation.

Until cleanup is complete, you will need to submit quarterly reports to this office and the following items must be incorporated in your future reports or workplans:

- a cover letter from the responsible party or tank owner stating the accuracy of the report and whether he/she concurs with the conclusions and recommendations in the report or workplan
- site map delineating contamination contours for soil and groundwater based on recent data should be included and the status of the investigation and cleanup must be identified

- proposed continuing or next phase of investigation / cleanup activities must be included to inform this department of the responsible party or tank owner's intention

- historical records of groundwater level in each well must be tabulated to indicate the fluctuation in water levels
- tabulate analytical results from all previous sampling events; provide laboratory reports (including quality control/quality assurance) and chain of custody documentation

All reports and proposals must be submitted under seal of a California Registered Geologist or Registered Civil Engineer with a statement of qualifications for each lead professionals involved with the project.



It has been brought to my attention by Regional Board staff that a condition of soil and ground water pollution exists on your property from an unauthorized release associated with facility operation at the site. The Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACHD) staff have requested technical reports from you to fulfill your obligations per California Water Code.

A Pre-Enforcement Review Panel meeting was held at the ACHD Offices on May 19, 1994 attended by Mr. Kevin Graves, of my staff. Following the panel meeting, all parties were given the opportunity to submit additional materials up through and including August 12, 1994. That time having passed and pursuant to the Regional Board's authority under Section 13267(b) of the California Water Code, you are hereby required to submit a technical report to address soil and ground water pollution by September 30, 1994. This technical report should specifically address the following numbered items:

- 1) A report discussing the investigation regarding the contamination at the site completed to date and shall include but not limited to the groundwater monitoring data, monitoring well construction diagrams, soil boring data.
- 2) A work plan to define the vertical and lateral extent of the chlorinated solvents (VOC's) and the chromium contamination in soil and groundwater.
- 3) Interim remedial measures implemented or proposed to prevent the migration of the plumes to adjacent sites.

- 4) A report documenting the removal of the underground storage tanks at the site and analytical results of soil samples collected.
- 5) Proposed remedial action to be implemented at the site to prevent the migration and impact of the plumes to adjacent sites;
- 6) Determination of potential health risk posed by the presence of the contaminant plumes to on-site workers and to occupants of adjacent sites;

I am hereby transmitting this request for a technical report to ACHD for service and case handling. You should be aware that failure on your part to submit the requested technical report, or a submittal received after the date specified in this request may result in fines up to \$1,000 per day of delinquency. Your response to this technical report request should be sent to Susan L. Hugo at ACHD.

Please be advised that this is a formal request for technical reports pursuant to California Water Code Section 13267(b). Any extensions of the stated deadlines, or modifications of the required tasks, must be confirmed in writing by either this agency or the Alameda County Department of Environmental Health, Hazardous Materials Division.
