The City of Oakland > and/or the Bay Area Air Quality Management District would likely have > authority over dust control/nuisance issues. Regarding the gas station next door RO0000409 4276 MacArthur > Blvd...I have not seen any further reports about how they are going to > correct the leaking tank that is also polluting my property > underground, but that last one only discussed what they would be doing > on THEIR property and I believe it was something like just letting it > decompose underground (I could be mistaken---I don't have the report > on hand at the moment). But I have not seen a finalized authorized > mitigation plan from the County to the Unocal/Chevron---whatever oil > company is in charge---of this property.
