Dear 4237 Foothill Blvd LLC:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) understands that Mr. David Patten of the Chevron Environmental Management Company (Chevron), a Responsible Party for the listed fuel release case located immediately next door to your property at 1723 High Street in Oakland, and Ms. Kiersten Hoey of GHD, Inc., an environmental consulting company retained by Chevron to conduct the environmental work at the site, have requested access to your property to collect air samples from the crawl space beneath your building. The purpose is to determine if contamination in soil may be contaminating the air below and inside your building due to releases at the service station next door. Mr. Patten and Ms. Hoey have informed ACDEH that access has been denied since you have not signed and returned the access agreement. The purpose of this letter is to advise you in your decision regarding access. It is important that you respond.

A hydrocarbon release occurred at the service station located at 4265 Foothill Boulevard in the past, and the release contaminated soil, groundwater, and soil vapor beneath the site and the site vicinity. As the responsible party, Chevron is required by state regulations to define the full extent of the release(s) and to clean up the contamination to be protective of your health. Based on currently available data, it appears that your building could receive some of the contamination from this release. It is the intent of this work to determine if this may be the case.

Because soil vapors can contaminate buildings, Chevron and their consultant, Ms. Hoey with GHD, have requested limited access to the area below your building to collect air samples from the crawl space. The samples well will help determine if soil vapors may be contaminating the air in the crawl space and if cleanup actions are required on their part. If needed, the costs will be covered by Chevron. This effort was required by ACDEH in order to protect your health, or the health of your tenants. The work should also help with any future sales of the house. **ACDEH requests your response and cooperation in this matter.**

ACDEH encourages you to work with the Responsible Party Mr. Patten of Chevron and his consultant Ms. Hoey of GHD, and agree upon the terms necessary (i.e. your signature on the access agreement) to allow them access to your property. Please consider the request to access your property previously sent by them and respond to this correspondence within two weeks from the date of this letter with your decision.
