We are currently negotiating an agreement with the landowner (Kin Man Li) for an advancement of funds (loan) to perform the excavation work at 4035 Park Blvd., Oakland, CA, Case #RO0000429. I uploaded the revised work plan that address the excavation work last week. We have a tentative start date of September 14, 2009 for mobilization of the excavation contractor. Prior to that I will need to destroy well RS-5, which is included with the work plan. For me to finalize the agreement with the landowner, he is requiring confirmation of dates to perform the work, which I cannot due until I have a response from you. To complicate matters, I need to sign a contract with the selected contractor who is now requiring a move on (start date) on or near September 14, 2009 or he will have to pass on the job. That would require me to draft another RFB and postponed this work until next summer (to costly to excavate during the rainy season).

I am hoping you would have some time to review the revised work plan this week and be able to give me your comments.
