Meeting with Paul Tornatore, Michael Purchase, Jeff Baker, and Denis at 1:00 pm on 9/15/2005. Discussed the Web portal with demo for the Livermore site. Also discussed next phase of investigation for Livermore site. Vertical delineation and shallow soil gas will be proposed in a work plan within a few weeks.

Mike Purchase called on 6/2/2006. Agreed to meet on June 14 at 10:00 am.

Meeting with Jeff Baker of Tesoro and Mike Purchase and Jeffrey Gwinn of ARCTOS. Reviewed results of investigation. Dissolved phase contamination below screen zones of wells but wells appear to be monitoring highest concentrations and providing representative data. Lower coarse-grained intervals did not yield groundwater. Regional aquitard encountered at about 82 feet bgs. Will ACEH require additional investigation to delineate lateral extent of TPHg since 2,000 ppb detected in DB-6, furthest downgradient location. Discussed bio trap samplers, isotope studies, baiting trap and adding oxygen to calculate degradation rate. Review Microbial Insights website or microbe.com. Potential to stimulate aerobic and get effects at MW-9. Will be sampling in July and put traps in after purging. May want to use two different types of remediation for on-site source and off-site contamination in Safeway parking lot.

I spoke to Jim Ellis of Livermore Arcade today. He wondered what the results of the Beacon investigation were. I informed him that the P&T report appeared not yet to have been submitted, although the work plan had been approved w/ changes in March 1993. He told me that the most recent sampling of wells on his site showed "ND" for gasoline constituents during June '93. I asked if he knew whether the wells on his site had been affected by any increase in GW elevations as a result of the heavy '92-93 rains. He didn't. He also wondered if any "clean up orders" had been issued to Beacon. I informed him that I didn't believe so, and that other PRPs may still be considered as viable sources of the past gasoline impact to wells on his site. I advised that he should contact Eva Chu (ACDEH) re: this issue upon her return.

Mr. Ellis said that the RWQCB is getting close to issuing an "order" for the P&E cleanup at his site.
