Roger,

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) is providing oversight for several Port of Oakland (Port) cases. Discussions with the Port suggest at least two of these cases are under the oversight of the San Francisco Bay Region, Regional Water Quality Control Board (SF-RB). Two of the cases in question are:

SF-RB CASE #: 01-1538 (Global ID T0600101587), Port of Oakland / Union Pacific Railroad and addressed as 1717 Middle Harbor Road (ACEH case file # RO0000035)

and

SF-RB CASE #: 01-1538 (Global ID T0600101421) Port of Oakland / Union Pacific Motor Freight (ACEH case file # RO0000435) and addressed as 1750 Ferro Street.

Geotracker lists ACEH as the lead agency for both of these cases. However, as part of the Port redevelopment project named the Vision 2000 program (aka V2K), the SF-RB issued an Order, Order 99-055, that may have transferred oversight of cases along a portion of the Oakland waterfront to the SF-RB. I've included a correspondence from the Port regarding this issue as an attachment.

My questions include:

1. Are the two cases encompassed by Order 99-055,
2. Is the order still in place, and
3. Is the SF-RB acting as lead.

If the answer is yes to all three questions, ACEH will close out the cases. If not, lets discuss the status of the cases and determine which agency should be the acting lead agency.
