Hi Jerry,

You will find attached a pdf copy of the geophysical report for the subject site (document 20thAvenueGeophysicalReport.pdf). Drawing 4 summarizes conditions at the site pretty well. A copy of the geophysical report will be included in the subsurface investigation report that will be submitted following the completion of drilling at the site.

I propose to add one additional boring designated as B9 to define the southwestern extent of suspected petroleum hydrocarbons in groundwater in the sand body identified at the 20 foot depth closest to E 12th Street (on the left side of the transect). The borehole will be located on the north side of 20th Avenue at the back of the western-most car shown in 20th Street (at the fifth dot on the transect when counting from left to right). The borehole will be continuously cored to a maximum depth of 30 feet and a grab groundwater sample will be collected. Field procedures and analytical methods associated with the boring and the groundwater sample will be the same as set forth in the approved work plan for groundwater grab sample collection.

Please let me know your thoughts on this proposed additional borehole. Thank you!
