Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the *Revised Work Plan for Focused Off-Site Subsurface Vapor Evaluation*, dated September 29, 2017, and the revised Figure 2, dated September 2018. This figure was submitted in response to a meeting held on September 24, 2018, with potential buyers of the property and the current proposed redevelopment.

The work plan and revised figure were prepared and submitted to ACDEH and Geotracker by PES Environmental, Inc. (PES). The work plan proposed the installation of five permanent subslab vapor points co-located with existing soil vapor probes, three temporary vapor probes along the southern property line, the installation of one temporary probe near the location of former PSV13, and one temporary vapor probe south of PSV13 to attempt to delineate the offsite vinyl chloride vapor plume. Data collection details were additionally described in the referenced work plan.

As discussed and agreed in the September 2018 meeting, the revised figure documented the change at all locations from temporary to permanent, including those near PSV13 near the southern edge of the adjacent offsite building, and along the southern property line of the subject property.

Based on ACDEH staff review of the referenced documents the resulting proposed scope of work is conditionally approved for implementation *provided that the technical comments below are incorporated* during the proposed field investigation. Submittal of a revised work plan or a work plan addendum is not required unless an alternate scope of work outside that described in the work plan or technical comments below is proposed. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the reports described below. Please provide 72-hour advance written notification to this office (e-mail preferred to: mark.detterman@acgov.org) prior to the start of field activities.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- Conditional Work Plan Approval The referenced work plan proposes a series of actions with which ACDEH is in general agreement of undertaking; however, ACDEH requests several modifications to the approach as detailed below. Please submit a report by the date specified below.
 - a. Shroud Tracer Concentration Please ensure the shroud tracer concentration is documented at each vapor sampling location in order to determine the percentage of atmospheric leakage into the vapor samples, if any. Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) allows up to a 5 percent leakage. ACDEH requests the helium tracer concentration be maintained in the shroud at a minimum of 20% throughout the sampling event.

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

<u>Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases</u>

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.
