

Dear Mr. Truzzolino:

This letter transmits the enclosed underground storage tank (UST) case closure letter in accordance with Chapter 6.75 (Article 4, Section 25299.37[h]). The State Water Resources Control Board adopted this letter on February 20, 1997. As of March 1, 1997, the Alameda County Environmental Protection Division is required to use this case closure letter for all UST leak sites. We are also transmitting to you the enclosed case closure summary. These documents confirm the completion of the investigation and cleanup of the reported release at the subject site. The subject fuel leak case is closed.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND CLEANUP SUMMARY

Please be advised that the following conditions exist at the site:

- up to 2,600ppm TPH as gasoline, 5,500ppm TPH as diesel, and 7.9ppm benzene exists in soil beneath the site;
- up to 320ppb TPHg and 12ppb benzene exists in groundwater beneath the site; and,
- a site safety plan must be prepared for construction workers in the event of excavation/trenching is proposed in the vicinity of residual soil and groundwater contamination.
