

HOLLIS STREET PROJECT
TANK REMOVAL
6050 HOLLIS STREET
EMERYVILLE, CA.

1. Removed two (2) 500 gallon storage tanks from the ground in April 1987.
2. One tank contained about 100 gallons of heating oil and the other was empty.
 - a. The 100 gallons of heating oil was removed and used as fuel for sheetrock drying heaters.
 - b. The two tanks were then cleaned and cut up by torch for scrap metal.
3. On July 15, 1987 a sample of the soil was taken from the pit (where tanks were removed) by Brown and Caldwell Laboratories.
4. On July 16, 1987 we received a letter from Emeryville Fire Department informing me that there were now procedures and codes to follow in the tank removal process.
5. On July 16, 1987 we contacted Ted Gerow of Alameda County Health Services Agency, Department of Environmental Health and inquired about the correct procedure to follow in filling the pit.
 - a. He said he would send us a form called "Underground Storage Tank Unauthorized Release (Leak) Contamination Site Report" to be filled out and returned to him.
 - b. He told us to make sure that if there were leaks and the soil was contaminated that the bad soil be removed from the pit and aerated.
6. On July 24, 1987 Brown and Caldwell were at the property and sampled soil as we were removing from the pit until the soil appeared clean. They then took two samples, analyzed them and stated that they were below the allowable limits for the San Francisco Bay Area Regional Water Control Board.
7. We then took approximate 2½ yards of the most "oiled soil" and removed it to another location to aerate and the remaining clean soil and fill was replaced and paved over.
