(From information gathered, this well was screened below the water table in the past. Currently water levels are deeper, so this well may be adequate)

Ms. MalWhinney discussed her recommendation at the end of the Sept 28, '92 report. She stated that she wished to collect monthly water level measurements at the site and when and if the gradient is determined to be going towards one of the on-site wells, including the existing (former) well MW-1 that is at the site, then the downgradient well at the Fire will be sampled. Ms. Shui added that if the gradient, while on site, is ~~not~~ does not flow in the direction of any of the existing wells for a period of a quarter, that quarterly sampling of the nearest well to the tank pit

~~Mr. Zacor~~ Ms. Shin stated that Ms. Malohimney never called to report the lab analysis results from yesterday's soil sampling at the above site. Mr. Zacor stated that that was because the analysis came back after 5:00 p.m. According to the analysis, 7.2 ppm diesel was detected from the west wall soil sample. All other soil samples from tank pit were N.D. (TPH analysis included). The stockpiled soil samples are have been collected and are on hold until after the tank pit excavation. The analysis & results of the stockpiled soil samples will determine whether the formerly clean fill will be used to backfill and whether the excavated soils can be hauled to Mountain View Landfill. Ms. Shin stated that if and only if the stockpiled soil samples come up N.D. can they be hauled to this landfill.

Ms. Malohimney called from the site. She stated that only about 1 bucket full of additional soil from the west wall will probably be excavated before resampling.
