Discussed the issues regarding the two sets of laboratory data from Superior Analytical for the above site. Still no good explanation as to why two sets of lab data were generated and at what level the error or fraud occurred. To date, both Superior Analytical and Sierra Environmental are claiming that they only had one set of lab data, the ones containing the higher concentrations. Superior claims that they did not produce two sets of data, even though both sets are on their letterhead. And if Sierra Environmental submitted the wrong lab data, with the lower concentrations, to Chevron for all those quarters, why do they now only have copies of the correct lab data sheets? Chevron is still investigating the situation. Sierra recently submitted a response letter to Chevron, and Mr. Miller thinks that they copied the County on it. The County has not yet received this letter.

Blaine Tech has already gone out to collect quarterly samples from the site. Mr. Miller will call to update the County on the status of the next quarterly.

Chevron's consultants have begun to prepare a risk assessment for the site addressing residential scenario.
