I am sorry but my work on the Regional Board's closure reviews and closures themselves has precluded me from reviewing your work plan in the usual 60 days. If you decide to implement your work plan, you would be doing so without concurrence from ACEH. If no comments arise from the review of the work plan, then proceeding with the work would not appear to have any significant repercussions. However, if comments to the work plan are identified, modifications to the fieldwork may be necessary, which may require additional mobilizations and /or additional sample analyses, etc. Please note that the UST Cleanup Fund typically reimburses costs for a scope of work that has been approved by a regulatory agency. Terry - I wanted to remind you that we have yet to receive a response from ACEHS regarding the work proposed in our July 20, 2009 Work Plan for Additional Assessment and Remediation Pilot Testing. With the TPHg concentrations observed in the grab sample collected from SB-4 (45,000 ug/L) and the depth to water (less than 20 feet), the shallow soil gas sampling really should be done to evaluate the potential for vapor intrusion into the adjacent building.
