ERI submitted a work plan for monitoring well installation at 3450 35th Avenue, Oakland (RO#2515), which was approved by the ACEH in a letter dated December 30, 2008. The letter requested the results of the well installation be reported by March 6, 2009. ERI has submitted an access agreement and encroachment permit materials for the off-site portion of the work and is in the process of scheduling subcontractors. We have contacted our Exxon Mobil approved drilling subcontractors and the soonest we can schedule the drilling is the week of March 2-6, 2009, with well development occurring the following week. Since field activities will not be completed until the March 13th, it will not be possible to report the results of field work by the proposed March 6th due date.

ERI proposes to adjust the due date for the results report to April 30, 2009. Please let me know if this is acceptable.
