

Transfer of RB File No. 01-2581 to ACWD -

Shell-Branded Service Station at 31235 Mission Blvd., Hayward

Dear Steven:

Pursuant to our discussion with Tom Berkins of your staff, we hereby transfer one more Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) case from the Hayward Fire Department (HFD) as a Local Implementing Agency (LIA) to the Alameda County Water District (ACWD) as another LIA. This brings to eleven (11) the total number of LUFT cases within the incorporated areas of the City of Hayward that are under ACWD oversight.

The subject case is RB File # 01-2581, the Shell-Branded Service Station at 31235 Mission Blvd. Shell Oil Products US is the named "responsible party" for this case.

We understand that this site, although not directly within the recharge zone of ACWD, is of interest to you because of its proximity to one of your production wells south of the site, in Union City.

We have reviewed the Geotracker file for the case, moving the site marker to more accurately locate it on the Geotracker Map. Then, we amended the "Lead Agency" from HFD to ACWD, and named "Unknown" as the new caseworker from your agency for this case. We will lose access to this case on Geotracker as soon as the system uploads the changes we have made.

Through a copy of this letter, we are informing Shell Oil Products US and its consultants, Delta Environmental Services, Inc. and KHM Environmental Management, Inc., about the case transfer. We will give them your name and address as the new contact, pending your assigning it to one of your staff.

We are similarly informing the Regional Board of the transfer.

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We are enclosing herewith all documents we have on file that are relevant to this case. From hereon, we shall refer all inquiries regarding the LUFT case to your office. As this is also an active UST site, we are retaining records about the operating service station on site, which we still regulate under the Unified Hazardous Materials and Hazardous Waste Management (CUPA) Program.
