Dear Mr. McCoy:

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) staff has reviewed the Spills, Leaks, Investigation, and Cleanup (SLIC) case file for the above referenced site including the recently submitted document entitled, "Conceptual Site Model and Work Plan for Sub-Slab Vapor Investigation, 751-785 Seventh Street, Oakland, California," dated June 2012 (CSM/Work Plan). The CSM/Work Plan, which was prepared on your behalf by Baseline Environmental Consulting, presents a conceptual site model (CSM) and proposes additional sub-slab vapor sampling inside the existing site building.

The CSM reviews historical references to discuss the site history, previous investigation results, and potential source areas. The compilation of this information provides a useful resource for future site assessment and we thank you for the compilation.

Based on our review of the CSM/Work Plan, we have several technical comments that require some additional information and some modifications to the Work Plan. Therefore, we request that you address the technical comments below and submit a Revised Work Plan by September 21, 2012.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

1. Sub-slab Soil Vapor Sampling. We concur with the proposal to conduct additional sub-slab vapor sampling beneath the existing building. However, in order to review the proposed sampling locations, we request additional information regarding the current interior configuration of the building or relevant construction details that could affect the potential for vapor intrusion. Please present a diagram of the building showing the locations of interior walls with a description of the activities that take place within different areas of the building such as offices, meeting rooms, etc. Please present this information in the Revised Work Plan requested below.

- 2. Further Assessment of VOCs in Area of Former Frog Pond. We concur with the conclusion that the highest concentrations of VOCs in soil vapor appear to be in the area of the Former Frog Pond. Remediation of the Former Frog Pond area will be required to address elevated concentrations of hexavalent chromium, other metals, and VOCs in soil and groundwater. However, we do not concur with the conclusion that further investigation of VOCs in the Former Frog Pond area should be deferred pending development plans for this area of the site. Due to the potential for vapor intrusion to affect the off-site building immediately south of the site, additional soil vapor sampling is needed in the area of the Former Frog Pond and the former drum storage area shown south of the Former Frog Pond on Figure 8 of the CSM/Work Plan. Please include plans to conduct soil vapor sampling in these areas in the Revised Work Plan requested below.
- 3. Additional Soil Vapor Sample in Potential Source Area 6. Potential sources of VOCs in Potential Source Area 6 include the Sand Blast Area, degreasing activities, and drum storage. In order to assess the potential for vapor intrusion to the existing off-site building south of the site, we request that you include plans to conduct soil vapor sampling at a minimum of one location in Potential Source Area 6 north of the off-site building. Please include these plans in the Revised Work Plan requested below.
- 4. **Figure 9.** In future reports that include Figure 6, please revise the notations for the Soil Gas Sample Location shown immediately west of the Former Frog Pond. The location appears to be SG-04 not S-06 and the concentration of TCE at 4.0 feet bgs is 23,000 μ g/m³ rather than 2300 μ g/m³.

Responsible Party(ies) Legal Requirements / Obligations

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

ACEH's Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program FTP site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to Spills, Leaks, Investigations, and Cleanup (SLIC) sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). PERJURY STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I declare, under penalty of perjury, that the information and/or recommendations contained in the attached document or report is true and correct to the best of my knowledge." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6735, 6835, and 7835.1) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately registered or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this fuel leak case meet this requirement.

UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, later reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

SUBJECT: Electronic Report Upload (ftp) Instructions

The Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SLIC) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please do not submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. Documents with password protection will not be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
 - a) Contact the Alameda County Environmental Health Department to obtain a User Name and Password to upload files to the ftp site.

 - b) In the subject line of your request, be sure to include "ftp PASSWORD REQUEST" and in the body of your request, include the Contact Information, Site Addresses, and the Case Numbers (RO# available in Geotracker) you will be posting for.
- 2) Upload Files to the ftp Site
 - a) Using Internet Explorer (IE4+), go to ftp://alcoftp1.acgov.org
 - (i) Note: Netscape, Safari, and Firefox browsers will not open the FTP site as they are NOT being supported at this time.
 - b) Click on Page located on the Command bar on upper right side of window, and then scroll down to Open FTP Site in Windows Explorer.
 - c) Enter your User Name and Password. (Note: Both are Case Sensitive.)
 - d) Open "My Computer" on your computer and navigate to the file(s) you wish to upload to the ftp site.
 - e) With both "My Computer" and the ftp site open in separate windows, drag and drop the file(s) from "My Computer" to the ftp window.

 - d) If your document meets the above requirements and you follow the submission instructions, you will receive a notification by email indicating that your document was successfully uploaded to the ftp site.
