Dear Karel:

I have been out of the country since May 31—just got back and opened my mail. We do not currently have a consultant under contract, although we have had a lot of outreach related to the LTCP. We would have to go through the vetting process again to choose a consultant. As you may know, what various companies can bring to the process is all over the board. I assume that any meeting without that entity in the room would be non-productive?

I will have to come up with a consultant before scheduling this meeting. Hopefully, there is enough experience in the industry now, as it relates to the adoption of the LTCP, that we can bring this to closure without the un-affordable estimates we were given for just the next stage of information gathering in this seemingly unending process.

We have spent over \$50,000 so far, and have been told that we cannot access any of the State funds for UST mitigation because of a lack of definitive proof that our gasoline suppliers in the past had paid the taxes to Franchise Tax Board on our purchases! This dates back to the 70's. So, no help from the State, then seven years of struggle through this Recession. We really do want closure on this, both

figuratively and literally.

I will start looking for a reasonable consultant to represent us at the table and to interpret what may or may not be required to come to a finish.
