Subject: Project Update Former St Francis Pie Shop, 1125 67th Street Oakland, California ACDEH Site No. RO2602

Ladies and Gentlemen:

With this letter, I wish to inform you of Mr. Buschini's passing, which I happened to notice in the Contra Costa Times (see attached). It had been my sincerest hope to be able to help Mr. Buschini obtain regulatory closure for his site, and I am deeply saddened that I was not able to do so.

I first met Mr. Buschini in early 2004, while conducting a Phase I ESA for a potential purchaser of the St. Francis Pie property. At that time, Mr. Buschini was in the process of closing St. Francis Pie Shop and selling the various facility baking and ancillary equipment. Mr. Buschini was also in the process of having the site USTs removed at this time.

We were again contacted by Mr. Buschini in early 2006 to provide a proposal for environmental services to move the site towards regulatory closure. Mr. Buschini indicated that he could not settle the accounts and close the St Francis Pie Shop corporation until he sold the subject property, which he could not do without site closure. Also, since Mr. Buschini could not directly fund our activities, we agreed to wait for reimbursement from the UST Cleanup Fund before being paid. We subsequently conducted a Soil Boring Investigation and a Remedial Investigation which showed that (1) a gas station was located immediately east from the project site which could have contributed to project site impacts, and (2) fuel (principally MTBE) soil and groundwater impacts from the site UST are very localized and do not extend a significant distance from the former UST source area.

In discussing these investigative results with Mr. Barney Chan of your office, we relayed Mr. Buschini's desire to achieve site closure quickly and asked whether some form of quick source remediation, such as ozone injection (which has been shown to be very effective on MTBE-only plumes) could get us to closure quicker than simply monitoring. Mr. Chan indicated that this was possible, and, as such, we submitted the ozone injection workplan in the Remedial Investigation report in May 2007. However, as you know there have been delays in approving the ozone injection pilot test workplan. UST Cleanup Fund, we are not sure that funds are available to conduct the pilot test (we are currently waiting on payment and have all but stopped work on this project).

I talked to Mr. Buschini on Thursday, July 9, 2009 and stated my belief that this site should be closed without the need for source area remediation. The original proposal for an ozone injection pilot test was to try to close this site relatively rapidly (without long-term monitoring). However, we currently have over two years of quarterly monitoring results for five site wells that show a small, localized, stable MTBE groundwater plume.

As stated in the July 9, 2009 quarterly monitoring report, we believe that this site should be reviewed for regulatory closure as a "low risk" commercial property, based on the following criteria:

- The source (UST, piping, and soil/groundwater overexcavation) has been removed.
- The site has been adequately characterized, essentially to nondetect in all directions.
- The contaminant plume is not migrating, and chemical concentrations in groundwater are expected to meet water quality objectives in the future.
- No other waters of the State, water supply wells, or other sensitive receptors are likely to be impacted.
- The site does not pose a significant risk to human health or safety.

Subject to your approval, a formal closure request can be prepared which details these closure criteria and, I believe, provides a basis for granting site closure.
