Also, I stated that a more detailed work plan addendum would need to be submitted outlining safety measures for restoration if & when it is ready to be implemented. - J.S. 10/18/94

9/27/94 Dean Di Giovanni (510) 287-1656

Discussed my comments on report, outlined in todays letter to EBWSD. Asked why the TRPH analysis results were not included in report. He stated that the TRPH levels given in tables is the addition of the semi-volatile contaminants detected. Mr. Di Giovanni stated that vehicles will be driving over sites in areas around the ball field too, & that EBWSD intends to restore these damaged areas of turf after the basin construction. I reminded him to be sure & water all soils down during activities & recommended the use of a dust mister. Mr. Di Giovanni stated that the Merritt sand would be placed around the basin. I required an impermeable layer to prevent cross-contamination from perched water in fill to Merritt sand.

- 9/22/94 Duan DiGiovanni 287-1656 Mr. DiGiovanni stated that the property that the pump house is on is owned by EBMD. The rest of the park property is owned by the City of Alameda.
- 9/29/94 Spoke to Richard Sykes and Alex Coate, EBMD Clarified question regarding whether or not EBMD would be financing investigations and cleanup in the areas of Kusi Park, outside of the storage basin construction. They said no. I explained then that it would be that portion of the site would be transferred to SLIC w/ City of Alameda as RPs. EBMD stated that they just promised to restore damaged areas in Negative Declaration.
