I was reminded today that I had not heard back in regards to this question from several weeks ago that I put to Chris Baldassari at the end a conversation associated with the Emery Bay Marketplace (RO440).

Stellar Environmental, the consultant for a contaminated site immediately across 64th Street (Garrett Freightlines / Bay Center; RO2799) from the redevelopment associated with the former Lerer Brothers Transmission site reports that groundwater contaminant concentrations in the well (MW-3) nearest to 64th Street have been increasing for the past two or three semi-annual groundwater monitoring events. Basically the dewatering is pulling the TPHd plume to the south and may be mobilizing some free phase. Do you have a timeline for the end of construction dewatering? This will help them determine a course of action.
