Dear Ladies and Gentlemen:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the *Subsurface Investigation and Sensitive Receptor Survey*, dated January 12, 2006 (received May 2, 2017). The document was prepared and submitted on your behalf to ACDEH by AllWest Environmental, Inc. (AllWest). Thank you for submitting the report. The report documented the installation of soil bores AWB-7 to AWB-11 for the collection of groundwater samples, and AWSG-1 to AWSG-3 for the collection of soil gas samples at the site.

Previous work conducted at the former dry cleaning site included the installation of soil bores SB-1 to SB-6 in January and March 2005, and soil bores AWB-1 to AWB-6 in May 2005. In those soil bores, concentrations in soil up to 3.1 milligrams per kilogram (mg/kg) tetrachloroethene (PCE), <0.25 mg/kg trichloroethene (TCE), and 0.019 mg/kg vinyl chloride (VC) were detected beneath the site. Additionally, concentrations in groundwater up to 230 micrograms per liter (ug/l) PCE, 14 ug/l TCE, and 25 ug/l VC were detected (*Subsurface Investigation Report*, AllWest, June 30, 2005). A subsequent work plan (*Subsurface Investigation and Assessment Workplan*, AllWest, dated October 31, 2005) was submitted and conditionally approved by ACDEH in a directive letter dated November 2, 2005. An investigation report was requested to be submitted by March 2, 2006; however, the report was not apparently received until May 2017 in response to the April 11, 2017 letter. As before, thank you for submitting it.

Because concentrations of the listed contaminants in soil, groundwater, and soil vapor are substantially above the generally recognized as safe, February 2016 Environmental Screening Levels (ESLs), as promulgated by the San Francisco Bay Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB), ACDEH would like to discuss the site, and paths forward, with each of you in a meeting in our office. Significant changes in our understanding of the risk of vapor intrusion has occurred since the work was conducted, and it is apparent that additional investigation is required.

Please provide ACDEH with several dates and times during which a meeting can be scheduled to discuss a path forward. ACDEH staff will either select dates and times from your list to arrange the meeting, or provide alternative dates. Please provide a list of available dates and times by **July 31, 2017.**

As your email address does not appear above, ACDEH is requesting that you provide your email address so that we can communicate with you quickly and efficiently regarding your case. Online case files are available for review at the following website: <u>http://www.acgov.org/aceh/index.htm</u>.

Thank you for your cooperation. ACDEH looks forward to working with you and your consultants to advance the case toward closure.

REPORT REQUESTS

These reports are being requested pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party in response to an unauthorized release from a petroleum UST system, and require your compliance with this request.

ELECTRONIC SUBMITTAL OF REPORTS

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health's (ACDEH) Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of reports in electronic form. The electronic copy replaces paper copies and is expected to be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities. Instructions for submission of electronic documents to the Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Program File Transfer Protocol (FTP) site are provided on the attached "Electronic Report Upload Instructions." Submission of reports to the Alameda County FTP site is an addition to existing requirements for electronic submittal of information to the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) GeoTracker website. In September 2004, the SWRCB adopted regulations that require electronic submittal of information for all groundwater cleanup programs. For several years, responsible parties for cleanup of leaks from underground storage tanks (USTs) have been required to submit groundwater analytical data, surveyed locations of monitoring wells, and other data to the GeoTracker database over the Internet. Beginning July 1, 2005, these same reporting requirements were added to SCP sites. Beginning July 1, 2005, electronic submittal of a complete copy of all reports for all sites is required in GeoTracker (in PDF format). Please visit the SWRCB website (http://www.waterboards.ca.gov/water_issues/programs/ust/electronic_submittal/) for more information on these requirements.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT STATEMENT

All work plans, technical reports, or technical documents submitted to ACDEH must be accompanied by a cover letter from the responsible party that states, at a minimum, the following: "I have read and acknowledge the content, recommendations and/or conclusions contained in the attached document or report submitted on my behalf to ACDEH's FTP server and the SWRCB's GeoTracker website." This letter must be signed by an officer or legally authorized representative of your company. Please include a cover letter satisfying these requirements with all future reports and technical documents submitted for this fuel leak case.

PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATION & CONCLUSIONS/RECOMMENDATIONS

The California Business and Professions Code (Sections 6731, 6735, and 7835) requires that work plans and technical or implementation reports containing geologic or engineering evaluations and/or judgments be performed under the direction of an appropriately licensed or certified professional. For your submittal to be considered a valid technical report, you are to present site-specific data, data interpretations, and recommendations prepared by an appropriately licensed professional and include the professional registration stamp, signature, and statement of professional certification. Please ensure all that all technical reports submitted for this case meet this requirement. UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK CLEANUP FUND

Please note that delays in investigation, late reports, or enforcement actions may result in your becoming ineligible to receive grant money from the state's Underground Storage Tank Cleanup Fund (Senate Bill 2004) to reimburse you for the cost of cleanup.

AGENCY OVERSIGHT

If it appears as though significant delays are occurring or reports are not submitted as requested, we will consider referring your case to the Regional Board or other appropriate agency, including the County District Attorney, for possible enforcement actions. California Health and Safety Code, Section 25299.76 authorizes enforcement including administrative action or monetary penalties of up to \$10,000 per day for each day of violation.

The Alameda County Environmental Cleanup Oversight Programs (LOP and SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the county's ftp site. Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please <u>do not</u> submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. Documents with password protection <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
 - a) Contact the Alameda County Environmental Health Department to obtain a User Name and Password to upload files to the ftp site.

 - b) In the subject line of your request, be sure to include "ftp PASSWORD REQUEST" and in the body of your request, include the Contact Information, Site Addresses, and the Case Numbers (RO# available in Geotracker) you will be posting for.
- 2) Upload Files to the ftp Site
 - a) Open File Explorer using the Windows
 i) Note: Netscape, Safari, and Firefox browsers will not open the FTP site as they are NOT being supported at this time.
 - b) On the address bar, type in ftp://alcoftp1.acgov.org.
 - c) Enter your User Name and Password. (Note: Both are Case Sensitive)
 - d) Click Log On.
 - e) Open "My Computer" on your computer and navigate to the file(s) you wish to upload to the ftp site.
 - f) With both "My Computer" and the ftp site open in separate windows, drag and drop the file(s) from "My Computer" to the ftp window.
