Dear Mr. Hoi Phua and Linll Lee:

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) staff has reviewed the case file including the *Underground Utility Survey and Modified Boring Locations*, dated October 15, 2018, prepared and submitted on your behalf by AEI Consultants. The letter documented the surveyed location, and reported the depth of, underground utilities at, and in the vicinity, of the site. As requested by ACDEH, the locations of soil bores SB-12 and SB-13 were modified based on the utility survey.

Based on ACDEH staff review of the letter, the proposed scope of work is conditionally approved for implementation provided that the technical comments below are incorporated during the proposed work. Submittal of a revised work plan or a work plan addendum is not required unless an alternate scope of work outside that described in the work plan or these technical comments is proposed. We request that you address the following technical comments, perform the proposed work, and send us the report described below. Please provide 72-hour advance written notification to this office (e-mail preferred to: mark.detterman@acgov.org) prior to the start of field activities.

TECHNICAL COMMENTS

- 1. Revised Bore Locations The revised locations of soil bores SB-12 and SB-13 appear to be reasonable based on the surveyed sanitary sewer utility location. The letter stated the bores will be installed within 2 feet of the surveyed sanitary sewer location.
- 2. Incorporation of Comments from Letters of April 4, and July 2, 2018 Please ensure comments contained in the April 4, 2018, and July 2, 2018 letters are incorporated into field work.
- 3. Observance of DTSC Rainfall Restriction Consistent with Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) guidance, please ensure that vapor samples are not collected within five days of a significant rainfall event, defined as ½-inch or greater of rainfall within a 24-hour period. Please ensure to document the rainfall within the five days prior to a sampling event in the report requested below.

Alameda County Department of Environmental Health (ACDEH) Cleanup Oversight Programs, Local Oversight Program (LOP) and Site Cleanup Program (SCP) require submission of all reports in electronic form to the State Water Board's (SWB) GeoTracker website in accordance with California Code of Regulations, Chapter 30, Division3, Title 23 and Division 3, Title 27.

Leaking Underground Fuel Tank (LUFT) Cases

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

A complete report submittal includes the PDF report and all associated electronic data files, including but not limited to GEO_MAP, GEO_XY, GEO_Z, GEO_BORE, GEO_WELL, and laboratory analytical data in Electronic Deliverable Format[™] (EDF).
