Ladies and Gentlemen:

This Directive Letter is in response to an e-mail ACDEH received on June 22, 2018 from West Associates Environmental Engineers, Inc. (West) on behalf of 6200 Shattuck Partnership, LLC West & Associates, regarding a schedule for future groundwater monitoring and sampling events at the site. Groundwater at the subject site has not been monitored and sampled since July 6, 2017.

Based on ACDEH staff review, we have determined that the site does not meet the LTCP General Criteria d (Free Product), f (Secondary Source Removal), Media-Specific Criteria for Groundwater, Media-Specific Criteria for Vapor Intrusion to Indoor Air, and the Media-Specific Criteria for Direct Contact.

### **TECHNICAL COMMENTS**

- 1. **Groundwater Monitoring –** Sheen/product was noted in groundwater sample for MW-101 by the analytical laboratory for total petroleum hydrocarbon as diesel (TPHd) and TPH motor oil in July 2017 along with continued elevated benzene, naphthalene, total petroleum hydrocarbon as gasoline (TPHg), and TPH diesel concentrations in MW-101 and MW-103. Please place all site monitoring wells at the site on a semi-annual groundwater monitoring and sampling schedule to be maintained until otherwise directed by ACDEH in writing. Please conduct semi-annual groundwater monitoring and sampling in September and March, to capture dry and wet season groundwater elevation and concentration fluctuations. As requested in our January 23, 2017 Directive Letter, please include a column listing field or laboratory indications of sheen/free product on the *Historical Groundwater Results Table*. Additionally, please include a rose diagram indicating groundwater gradient direction.
- 2. **Electronic Submittal of Information (ESI) Compliance:** For all reports, please continue to upload the following the Electronic Deliverable Format (EDF) to Geotracker:
  - analytical data for soil, water and vapor samples collected for the purpose of subsurface investigation or remediation, including influent/effluent water samples from remediation systems (EDF files);
  - surveyed elevation measurements to the top of well casings (GEO\_Z files);
  - depth-to-water information for permanent sampling points whenever the data is collected, even if the well is not sampled during the sampling event (GEO\_WELL files);

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• stand alone site maps displaying tank locations, streets bordering the facility, and sampling locations for all soil, water and vapor samples (GEO MAP files);

Reports and deliverable requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 25296.10. 23 CCR Sections 2652 through 2654, and 2721 through 2728 outline the responsibilities of a responsible party (RP) in conjunction with an unauthorized release from a petroleum underground storage tank (UST) system.

### Site Cleanup Program (SCP) Cases

For non-petroleum UST cases, reports and deliverables requests are pursuant to California Health and Safety Code Section 101480.

### AGENCY OVERSIGHT
