Response to Comments

- CPL and URS discontinued SVE system operations due to the inadequacy of the current SVE well configuration. URS needs to identify the appropriate depth of the remaining contaminant mass before proceeding with another round of SVE system operation.
- The EDR Well Search was included with the CSM. Forwarded by email 1/26/11.
- The SFPUC owns the land at and around the Site and is a source of income for the SFPUC. The SFPUC has no intentions, now or in the future, to sell the land for development.
- The Site is currently zoned as agricultural by Alameda County. Current zoning has parcel size restrictions (100 acres on the nursery side and 320 acres on the hillside). At this time, no parties are interested in having the land rezoned for commercial or residential use.

Environmental Screening Levels

- The purpose of the CSM was to come to an agreement as to what the environmental screening levels would be.
- Based on the current understanding of the Site, the groundwater source is believed to be from the infiltration of rain water.
- Migration of contaminants does not appear to be occurring off of the Site or to any surface water source.
- What environmental screening levels are acceptable to ACEHD?
- If URS conducts pumping tests at the Site and proved groundwater could not be produced at 200 gallons per day from any well, would ACEHD accept that Site groundwater has no beneficial use as per RWQCB guidelines?

Other Options

- Excavation and removal of the hillside source area. Does ACEHD have any issues with this option?
