Thank you for contacting me about this site. The process starts with me reviewing the case and creating Notice of Responsibility form for the site to notify the responsible party(ies). I also send out a letter requesting additional work if required. Since I have not reviewed the case yet, I cannot say what I will be requesting but since you asked what the process involves, I'm trying to be as general as possible. The work could include sampling groundwater to determine if it has been impacted or additional source area characterization, as deemed necessary. Should we decide that work is needed at the site, you can apply to the UST Fund for reimbursement for the funds that you expend to do the required work. This information will be included in the first letter that I send to you and your consultant may be able to help you with this request.
