Hello Lynn,

I have responded to your past submittals in a timely fashion and will try my best to continue to do so in the future. However, at this time, we require your timely cooperation. In our April 16, 2009 correspondence, ACEH requested that the Site be "Claimed" in State Water Resources Control Board's (SWRCB) GeoTracker database ([www.geotracker.waterboards.ca.gov](http://www.geotracker.waterboards.ca.gov)), as required by law, so that you can begin electronically submitting documents and site data for review. A review of the case file and the State's GeoTracker database indicate that the site still has not been "claimed," and no data has been uploaded rendering the site to non-compliance status, which limits our ability to review your submittals.

Attached is the GeoTracker Roles and Responsibilities guidance document prepared by the Water Board. In the "Electronic Reporting Roles and Responsibilities" document, it states "**Responsible Party (RP)**. This is the individual or organization responsible for submission of compliance data. They may be the party legally responsible for cleanup of an unauthorized release or discharge, **or the permittee for a cleanup site.**"

ACEH believes that although EAH Housing is not yet a owner of the property, they have been permitted by the property owner to access the site and assess the subsurface contamination. As such, EAH appears to quality as a permittee, who in turn must claim the site and begin electronic reporting as required. Please claim the site and upload the reports and site data by Friday, June 19, 2009.
