Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."
2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."
3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."
4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

ACEH has named the responsible parties for this site as detailed below.

Responsible Party Identification

Existence of Unauthorized Release

A July 2, 1986 report entitled "Fuel Tank Monitoring Well Installation Project Report" by Aqua Science Engineers Inc. documented the installation of one compliance well adjacent to a 1000 gallon tank. Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons as Diesel (TPHD) at 1,600 micrograms per liter (ug/l) were detected in a groundwater sample taken from the compliance well indicating an unauthorized release had occurred at this site. Analysis for benzene, toluene, ethyl benzene and xylenes (BTEX) were not performed.

Responsible Party Identification

The Alameda Public Improvement Corporation owned the property following the release from 1990 until 1996. The Alameda Public Improvement Corporation is a responsible party for the site because they owned the property where an unauthorized release occurred (Definition 3).

The City of Alameda purchased the property in 1996. The City of Alameda is a responsible party for the site because they are the current owners of a property where an unauthorized release occurred (Definition 3).
