Responsible Party Identification Background

Alameda County Environmental Health (ACEH) names a "Responsible Party," as defined under 23 C.C.R Sec. 2720. Section 2720 defines a responsible party 4 ways. An RP can be:

1. "Any person who owns or operates an underground storage tank used for the storage of any hazardous substance."

2. "In the case of any underground storage tank no longer in use, any person who owned or operated the underground storage tank immediately before the discontinuation of its use."

3. "Any owner of property where an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance from an underground storage tank has occurred."

4. "Any person who had or has control over an underground storage tank at the time of or following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance."

ACEH has named the responsible parties for this site as detailed below.

Responsible Party Identification

Existence of Unauthorized Release

A 2002 Phase I Environmental Assessment found that the site had been a gasoline service station between approximately 1947 and 1969. A 2004 subsurface investigation conducted a geophysical survey and found a generalized disturbed signature beneath the site. Five soil bores were also installed and found "low to moderate" concentrations of TPH, BTEX, and MTBE, generally below regulatory thresholds. Two petroleum hydrocarbon hotspots were encountered during site grading, up to 20 eight-foot deep soil bores were installed around Hotspot #1, soil samples collected, and ultimately approximately 25.5 tons of impacted soil was excavated off hauled. Hotspot #2 is described as a fill pit presumed to be a location of a former UST, soil samples were collected, and ultimately approximately 127.1 tons of soil was excavated and off-hauled. Concentrations up to 310 mg/kg TPHg, 629 mg/kg TPHd, 1,700 mg/kg TPHmo, <2.5 mg/kg benzene, <2.5 mg/kg toluene, 3.7 mg/kg ethylbenzene, 5.3 mg/kg total xylenes, and <2.5 mg/kg MTBE were encountered in the two hotspot locations. The chromatographic pattern for the TPHg and TPHd analysis are reported not to match standard patterns.

One UST of unknown size was encountered and abandoned in-place during installation of the fire service as the site continued construction. The UST was cleaned and backfilled. One soil sample was collected at a depth of approximately 5.5 ft bgs at a location approximately 2 feet east of the UST. Analysis of the soil sample indicated that 980 mg/kg TPHg, 870 mg/kg TPHd, 3,300 mg/kg TPHmo, <0.77 mg/kg benzene, 2.3 mg/kg toluene, 1.5 mg/kg ethylbenzene, 11.4 mg/kg total xylenes, and <0.77 mg/kg MTBE were present; additional analytes were also detected. In totality the data indicate that an unauthorized release has occurred at the site.

Responsible Party Identification

In October 1930 the Union Oil Company of California (Unocal / Chevron) purchased the property, and is therefore a former property owner associated with the underground storage tank (UST). The Union Oil Company of California (Unocal / Chevron) is a responsible party for the site because it owned or operated an UST used for the storage of a hazardous substance (Definition 1), owned or operated a UST immediately before the discontinuation of use (Definition 2), owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3) and had control over the UST at a time following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4).

In July 1969 Alvin W. and Dorothy M. Quilice purchased the property from the Union Oil Company of California (Unocal / Chevron). Mr. and Mrs. Quilice are responsible parties for the site because they owned an UST used for the storage of a hazardous substance (Definition 1), owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3) and had control over the UST at a time following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4).

City of Emeryville Redevelopment is a former property owner associated with the UST. The City of Emeryville is a responsible party for the site because it owned an UST used for the storage of a hazardous substance (Definition 1), owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3) and had control over the UST at a time following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4).

Placeworks LLC is a former property owner associated with the UST at the time of in-place abandonment. Placeworks LLC is a responsible party for site because it owned an UST used for the storage of a hazardous substance (Definition 1), owned the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3), and had control over the UST at a time following an unauthorized release of a hazardous substance (Definition 4).

Dan & Vic Diversified LLC is the property owner associated with an underground storage tank (UST). Dan & Vic Diversified LLC is a responsible party for the site because it owns the property where an unauthorized release has occurred (Definition 3).

Paper copies of reports will no longer be accepted. The electronic copy replaces the paper copy and will be used for all public information requests, regulatory review, and compliance/enforcement activities.

REQUIREMENTS

- Please <u>do not</u> submit reports as attachments to electronic mail.
- Entire report including cover letter must be submitted to the ftp site as a single portable document format (PDF) with no password protection.
- It is preferable that reports be converted to PDF format from their original format, (e.g., Microsoft Word) rather than scanned.
- Signature pages and perjury statements must be included and have either original or electronic signature.
- <u>Do not</u> password protect the document. Once indexed and inserted into the correct electronic case file, the document will be secured in compliance with the County's current security standards and a password. Documents with password protection <u>will not</u> be accepted.
- Each page in the PDF document should be rotated in the direction that will make it easiest to read on a computer monitor.
- Reports must be named and saved using the following naming convention:

RO#_Report Name_Year-Month-Date (e.g., RO#5555_WorkPlan_2005-06-14)

Submission Instructions

- 1) Obtain User Name and Password
 - a) Contact the Alameda County Environmental Health Department to obtain a User Name and Password to upload files to the ftp site.
 - i) Send an e-mail to <u>deh.loptoxic@acgov.org</u>
 - b) In the subject line of your request, be sure to include "ftp PASSWORD REQUEST" and in the body of your request, include the Contact Information, Site Addresses, and the Case Numbers (RO# available in Geotracker) you will be posting for.
- 2) Upload Files to the ftp Site
 - a) Using Internet Explorer (IE4+), go to <u>ftp://alcoftp1.acgov.org</u>
 - (i) Note: Netscape, Safari, and Firefox browsers will not open the FTP site as they are NOT being supported at this time.
