Hi Megan,

With a few caveats, this would be acceptable. Because hoses typically contain volatile chemicals (Have you taken a drink from one recently!? They have a very noticeable chemical "flavor"), collecting the sample should be from the metal spigot directly after it has run for a period. Additionally, I ask that Brent Wheeler's group collect the samples in order to collect the samples in laboratory supplied and appropriate glassware, have knowledge of appropriate sampling techniques and methods to minimize sampling errors, to document their sampling procedures, and to provide knowledge on an appropriate purge time. The declaration from the property owners you mention is also appropriate.
